

## Beautiful Fairfield Contest expanded for 2008 edition

The contest is back and the competition will be improving — literally — as the Fairfield Building and Zoning Division returns with its Beautiful Fairfield Contest. This year's contest has been expanded to offer three divisions, with three prizes to be awarded in each division.

As with last year's contest, homeowners can enter a significant landscaping project or a home improvement project (*interior or exterior*). The home improvement division, however, will offer two categories: those under \$5,000 and those with a value of \$5,000 and up.

Winners in each of the three divisions will vie for one of three top spots, each receiving a gift certificate from Jungle Jim's or Kroger. Those judged as first place winners will receive a \$500 gift certificate. Second place winners will receive a \$200 gift certificate. Third place winners get a \$100 gift certificate.

All winners will also receive an attractive yardsign identifying their property 1st, 2nd or 3rd place winners in each of the three divisions.

To enter, a resident will need to complete a brief entry form and submit a "before" and an "after" picture of the

project to be considered. Entry forms are available at the Municipal Building or online at [www.fairfield-city.org](http://www.fairfield-city.org). Projects must have been completed after January 1, 2007, to qualify for this year's contest.

Entries will be accepted until August 31. Judges will consider each entry during the first week of September, with the winners announced on Friday, September 12, during the annual September Dayz celebration in Village Green Park.

# Lawn care regulations: how tall is too tall?

Most residents find they need to cut their lawns frequently during the early spring. Growth can quickly occur, presenting homeowners with a difficult chore. When a homeowner is not able to tend to a yard, or has abandoned the residence, cutting the grass becomes a City matter.

Under City ordinance, lawns cannot have grass higher than eight inches. Laws also prohibit City crews from tending to overgrown yards until legal action takes its course, which is usually a four-week process. By then, the yard

can be up to four feet high.

The process begins with a notice sent by certified mail to the property owner of record. In the case of overgrown lawns, a five day notice is required. If the problem is litter and unsightly debris, a property owner has a 15 day notice to address the concern.

In some cases, the certified mail is returned undelivered and the whereabouts of a lawful owner is not known, requiring the publication of a legal ad before the City can take action

to clean up the property.

Once the issue is resolved through the appropriate legal channels, a property owner is responsible for the costs associated with maintaining a property. In addition to fines levied against the homeowner, the City places a lien on the property to cover the costs to clean up the unkempt yard.

Each year, the City must maintain 60 to 80 properties which are vacant or where an owner cannot be located. Some are carried over from a prior year.

## Fairfield's top-five violations cited by Building & Zoning Inspectors

Like most thriving communities, Fairfield has local rules and legislation to promote safety and repair of property. Over the years, five violations have been identified by inspectors in the Building & Zoning Division as being those most often cited in complaints:

**Roof/Roof Drainage:** By code, roof systems and downspouts must be maintained to ensure adequate drainage away from property to prevent dampness or damage to the walls or interior portions of a structure. Drains, gutters and downspouts must be free of obstruction and not discharge in such a manner that it creates a nuisance for others.

**Swimming Pools:** Installation of an inground or aboveground pool requires a building and electric permit. Any pool designed for a water depth of 18 or more inches must be protected by an enclosure at least four feet in height to ensure small children cannot access the pool. Gates must have self-latching closures to make the area inaccessible to small children.

**Inoperable/Unlicensed Vehicles:** Motor vehicles or trailers that are not operable or not licensed may not be kept on a property unless it is specifically zoned for such vehicles. Residential areas typically are not zoned for storage of such vehicles, where they may only be kept for a period up to 72-hours.

**Parking:** Motor vehicles or trailers may not be parked on grassy areas. Parking

may only occur on paved surfaces adequately graded for drainage.

**Rubbish/Garbage:** Properties must be maintained in such a way as to be reasonably free of trash and litter so that areas are not a detriment to public health, unsightly or unsanitary.

### Reporting a problem

Neighbors of vacant property or properties with maintenance or zoning issues are encouraged to contact Building Inspection and Zoning at 867-5318 to initiate City involvement. In many cases, the property owner will remedy the issues. If not, prompt action can be taken to minimize the time necessary before the City steps in to maintain the property. Names of those filing complaints are not reported to a property owner.

Recycle used refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners or dehumidifiers by calling a company called Unwanted Appliances at 1-888-886-9268. Unwanted Appliances will collect freon-based appliances at the curb for all Butler County residents at no charge. Freon is removed by a certified technician.

**Mondays & Wednesdays (April - December)**

**Limits:** There is a limit of two "like" appliances per household. For example, no more than two refrigerators, two freezers or two air conditioners will be collected. Appliances must be free of food, with all containers empty.



Any road improvement is a difficult, lengthy process from planning to completion. Add into the mix the work's potential impact on several important businesses within the construction zone, and the project becomes a formidable challenge for everyone involved.



Work along LeSaint Drive is one of those projects. For years, the concrete roadway has required significant annual repairs, prompting City planners to replace the road with an asphalt surface. First, however, the concrete must be removed.

Detailed planning for the \$550,000 project included careful coordination and communication with area businesses, with several public announcements of the impending work and resultant road closures and detours necessary to undertake the road replacement.

The replacement process began in early April with traffic allowed only northbound on LeSaint. As work progresses in various phases, detours will be posted.

One interim phase will require the complete closure of LeSaint

Drive at the railroad spur. Detours will be marked, with motorists asked to follow the detours and not take alternate routes or "shortcuts" which will hamper traffic patterns and compromise safety.

The work along LeSaint is expected to continue through June, weather permitting.

## SR 4/Crescentville bids set for May, summer work planned

Following years of planning, bids will be received in May for the widening of State Route 4 from Crescentville Road to Furniture Fair Drive. The project will also include significant upgrades to the intersection of SR 4 with Crescentville Road.

An additional lane will be added to both directions of SR 4. Northbound improvements

will occur from Crescentville to Furniture Fair Drive and southbound from Skyline Chili.

Construction is expected to continue throughout the summer. The project is a joint endeavor between the State of Ohio and the cities of Fairfield and Springdale. The Ohio Department of Transportation will oversee the project.







## Skill Levels

The following are the level of lessons for children. For American Red Cross (ARC) levels 2-6, the child should complete the prior course or equivalent, or complete an exit skills test of the prior course.

### Guppy (18 months to 3 years)

A parent is required to be with the child in the water. This course is equivalent to American Red Cross Parent and Child Aquatics Level B. Skills taught include: *Water entry and adjustment • Bubble blowing and underwater exploration • Front and back floats • Arm and leg action • Front and back glides • Rolling back to front and front to back • Personal safety*

### Turtle: (Preschoolers)

For 4 and 5 year olds. Basic but important swimming and safety skills are taught without the parent, including: *Front and back floats • Underwater exploration • Arm and leg action for front and back stroke • Water entry and*

*exit • Water adjustment • Personal water safety with emphasis on using life-jackets*

### Alligator: ARC Level 1

Must be at least six years old or be able to pass the skills learned at the Turtle level. Skill taught include: *Safe entry and exit • Underwater exploration with objects • Controlled bubble blowing • Front and Back floats with recovery • Changing directions • Treading hand and arm movements • Front and back stroke combined arm and leg action • Personal water safety • Helping others in distress*

### Seal: ARC Level 2 Fundamental Aquatic Skills

Skills taught include: *Jump-in entry • Underwater retrieval • Unsupported front and back glide • Front and back float with recovery • Treading arm and leg motions • Combined arm and leg action on front and back • Finning and sculling • Swimming on your side • Personal Water safety*

### Marlin: ARC Level 3 Stroke Development

Skills taught include: *Head first entry • Underwater retrieval • Rotary breathing • Front and back glides • Treading • Front and back crawl • Butterfly kick and body motion • General water safety protocol*

### Dolphin: ARC Level 4 Stroke Improvement

Skills taught include: *Stride and compact dives • Underwater Swimming and Feet first surface dive • Survival float and back float • Streamlined open turns • Treading and Sculling • Backstroke, Breaststroke, Front Crawl, and Butterfly • Elementary Backstroke • Scissor Kick • Rescue Assists and dealing with choking*

### Shark: ARC Level 5 Stroke Refinement

Skills taught include: *Shallow dives and starts • Treading with different kicks • Flip turns • Backstroke, Breaststroke, Front Crawl, and Butterfly • Elementary Backstroke and Sidestroke • Survival Swimming • Rescue Breathing*

### Advanced Swimming and Lifesaving: ARC Level 6

This is a new course designed to be challenging and fun for our most advanced swimmers. Life guarding skills, physical fitness, and personal water safety skills will be taught. It involves some of the same training our own lifeguard's use. Skills taught include: *Endurance training and aquatic fitness education • Competitive stoke flip and open turns • Surface dives and dives • Cold water survival • Leg only treading and movement • Lifeguard rescue techniques • Rescue breathing and CPR • Survival swimming and self rescue*

# Fire Department: Frequent questions asked

The Fire Department often receives calls from residents with common questions. The following are those most frequently asked:

## Where can I get fire extinguishers refilled?

The Fairfield Fire Department does not service or refill fire extinguishers. Look in the "yellow pages" under "fire equipment" to locate companies that can provide the needed service.

## How can I dispose of hazardous materials?

Fairfield Fire Department does not collect hazardous materials. (See story on page 2 for options.)

## Where are complaints filed for abandoned cars or property maintenance violations?

The Fairfield Building Department handles complaints regarding abandoned furniture, appliances, etc., on private property, housing code violations, abandoned cars on private property, and general property maintenance violations. Contact the Building Department at 867-5318.

## Where can I report a leaking fire hydrant?

To report a leaking or otherwise defective fire hydrant, or other problems with city-owned property, contact the Public Utilities Department at 858-7775.

## Where can I report abandoned vehicles parked in fire lanes or on public streets?

To report a car abandoned on a public street or parked in a fire lane, contact the Fairfield Police Department at 829-8201.

## How can I report fire hazards?

Report all fire hazards, including hazards in the workplace, hazardous waste, or any other problems that may pose a danger. Make a report to 867-5378 (all information is kept confidential).

## How can I file a complaint about Fairfield Fire Department personnel?

Complaints pertaining to Fairfield Fire

Department personnel may be made in person at Fire Administrative Offices, 375 Nilles Road, or by calling 867-5379.

## Where can I report suspicious arson activity?

If you have reason to believe that a person is setting a fire or has just set a fire, call 9-1-1 immediately. Be prepared to describe the suspect, including physical features and clothing as well as the location and nature of the suspicious activity. If you have information regarding a fire that has already occurred and is under investigation, call 867-5379.

## What steps should I take for the behavior of a child playing with fire?

Children who play with fire place themselves, their families, and their neighborhoods at risk. The Fairfield Fire Department Juvenile Fire Setter Program provides free intervention services to reduce the chances of further fire play behavior. Call 867-5378 for information.

## What type of a fire extinguisher should I have in my home?

Home extinguishers should have a rating of at least 2A10BC. This can be used on ordinary combustibles, flammable liquids or energized electrical equipment.

## Why is my Smoke Detector making a funny sound (chirping)?

Any time your smoke detector goes off, it's important to pay attention. If the detector is just chirping, thumping, or buzzing, it probably means that the battery is low. Replace the battery as soon as possible. For more information, call the Fire Prevention Bureau at 867-5378.

## Do I need a carbon monoxide detector in my house?

Yes, carbon monoxide is a colorless, odorless gas that is produced by

incomplete combustion of a hydrocarbon fuel. This could be caused by an improperly operating gas stove, gas water heater, oil or gas furnace, fireplace or kerosene heater. Even a motor vehicle operating in an enclosed space such as a garage, could cause carbon monoxide to build up inside your home.

## Fairfield lottery to award up to 20 free street trees

Fairfield's 2008 Tree Lottery offers to plant up to 20 trees at no cost to a property owner. The trees must be placed in the easement (between the street and sidewalk). With just a little water and care, a tree can grow up to be a valued part of your property! All single-family residents in Fairfield that own their property, have room to plant a tree within the guidelines of the ordinance, and meet the following criteria are eligible to enter.

■ Only single-family resident owners within the city limits are eligible to participate.

■ Property owners who fail to properly maintain their current street trees or a lottery tree will not be eligible to participate in future lotteries.

■ A property owner cannot win a tree in two consecutive years.

■ All trees must be planted within the corporation limits in the public right-of-way in accordance with the city's tree ordinance.

■ All decisions made by the Environmental Resources and Community Forest Commission are final.

■ Deadline for entry is September 15.

In following the standard procedure for a hang-up of a caller to the 9-1-1 system, Denise called the number to be sure everything was okay. It wasn't. The call was made by a victim of a violent domestic incident in which she was struck in the head by her husband and feared he was going to continue his violence.

Denise dispatched officers and remained on the telephone with the victim to gather information about the location of the husband and availability of weapons. She then provided information to the victim regarding resources to console her and help her escape future abuse.
