- Call to Order / Roll Call List was passed around.
 - Meeting called to order at 7:05 pm

- Minutes- Reviewed minutes from July. Joan made the motion, Sherry 2nd the motion. Minutes were approved.
- New Business
 - Gallery
 - Paul Miles opening reception is scheduled for August 22nd.
 - Community Showcase is scheduled for September 15th-17th. Letters of acceptance will be mailed on September 22nd and the opening reception for the Showcase is on Friday October 3rd from 6-8. The awards will be presented at 6:30pm.
 - Theatre Events
 - The flyers are being mailed out and tickets go on sale starting September 1st.
 - Tartan Terrors will be the first in the One Stage performances on October 18th. Some consideration to having a themed “Scotchtoberfest” in conjunction with the performance.
 - Village Green
 - Gee Your Band Smells Terrific has been rescheduled fro September 4th, due to a rain out of their scheduled performance on June 19th.
 - June Arts Fair had good crowds and number of participants, Sunday afternoon made for a long day for the participants, but they were happy with the turn out. Might consider a later afternoon start so the participants are breaking down during HFSO concert. Also work with area businesses to reduce competition.
 - Red White and Kaboom had the largest attendance in a while with large crowds at both Harbin Park and the Village Green, but not the pool.
 - Groovin had diverse bands with some large and some not as large crowds and followings and popular responses. Salsa band had to be replaced with a different band due to a performer change. Blue Stone Ivory is also scheduled to perform.
 - Swingin’ on the Green wrapped for the season on August 18th with the After Hours Band. They do not attract as large of crowds, but still have a good size following.
 - 10th Annual Hero’s Ride is set for August 24th and departs at 1pm. It is in conjunction with a display of life size murals from Lima Company Memorial “The Eyes of Freedom” (Marine Lance Corporal Michael J. Cifuentes is in the murals) on display in the Art Center. Impact the Hero is the charity being supported. Thunder Bay will be performing at Symmes Tavern after the ride.
 - 7th Annual Cruise In On the Green is scheduled for September 20th from 3:30 to 10 with the Bellairs performing starting at 7pm. The Lisa Brown Scholarship Fund at the Fairfield Community Foundation is the charity supported.
 - Huffman Park/Harbin Park
 - A Blues and BBQ concert has been rescheduled – 46 Long.
