MINUTES  
REGULAR MEETING OF COUNCIL  
MARCH 28, 2016

**Call to Order**

Mayor Steve Miller called the Regular Meeting of Council to order at 7:00 PM at the Fairfield Municipal Building, 5350 Pleasant Avenue.

**Prayer/Pledge of Allegiance**

Councilmember Snyder led in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Roll Call**

Clerk Wilson called the roll of Council. Present members were Councilmember Adam Jones, Councilmember Craig Keller, Councilmember Debbie Pennington, Councilmember Tim Abbott, Councilmember Mike Snyder, and Councilmember Bill Woeste.

Councilmember Jones, seconded by Councilmember Keller, moved to excuse Councilmember Oberson. Motion carried 6-0.

**Agenda Modifications**

No agenda modifications.

**Executive Session Requests**

Councilmember Abbott, seconded by Councilmember Jones, moved for Executive Session to discuss employment and compensation of a public official. Motion carried 6-0.

**Special Presentations and Citizen Comments**

**Chamber of Commerce Update**

Kert Radel, President of the Fairfield Chamber of Commerce, thanked the Mayor, Council and City staff for attending the annual dinner. He thanked Mayor Miller for the proclamation and Key to the City that was presented. He also announced a ribbon cutting at Element Materials Technology on April 5 at 5:15 PM, and introduced Matt Webb, General Manager, to talk about the event. Mr. Webb invited Mayor, Council and staff to tour the expansion of their facility on April 5, which is now the largest of their 52 facilities. He explained that the company tests all types of products, from medical to aviation to conveyor belts, and that they are very happy that this expansion will allow them to continue to grow their business.

David Brown, from the Butler County Auditor's Office, addressed Council as part of the Auditor's Office Community Outreach. He announced that the Board of Revision filing deadline is March 31 for anyone contesting their property value established by the Auditor's Office. Forms are available online for that process and documentation should be attached to show a recent change to the property. He announced that real estate taxes were due earlier this month, so money for local levies will be distributed to local governments soon. Lastly, he announced the Disabled Veterans Homestead Exemption of \$50,000 for a 100% disabled veteran. The deadline for Homestead Exemption is June 6.

## **Public Hearing(s)**

### **Joint Public Hearing – Starbucks at Stockton Station PUD**

Mayor Miller opened the public hearing at 7:15 PM. Clerk Wilson read the public hearing notice and called the roll of Planning Commission: Commissioner Hasselbeck, Commissioner Hassler, Commissioner Lepsky, Commissioner D'Epifanio, Commissioner Myron and Commissioner Begley. Planning Manager Erin Donovan presented the public hearing information, which showed the site plan, along with the front and rear elevations. The developer is proposing a 2,000 square ft. building with a drive-thru that exits out onto Stockton Station Lane and a small outdoor seating area. She stated that because the rear elevation faces Route 4, Starbucks agreed to do a little more to the appearance than they usually do to the rear elevation, including some windows and an awning. Ms. Donovan detailed the remaining steps of the process, which include review by the Planning Commission on April 13 at 6:00 PM, followed by second and third readings with Council. Mr. Yates, the developer for Starbucks, explained that this is the current prototype of all Starbucks buildings and their goal is a September opening. The public hearing closed at 7:25 PM.

Councilmember Keller thanked Chief Bennett and Firehouse 32 for meeting and dinner.

Councilmember Pennington announced that Marsh Park Fishing Lake will begin a seven-day operation on Friday, April 1. She also announced that tickets for the AudioBody concert, which is Friday, April 1, are available. The Fairfield Historical Society meeting will be on April 5 at Elisha Morgan Mansion with Tom Stander, "Religious History of Fairfield Township."

Councilmember Abbott thanked Finance Director Mary Hopton for the CIP Review during the briefing meeting. He also thanked Fire Chief Don Bennett for great work on two fires in the community last week.

Councilmember Snyder gave an update on the Pleasant Avenue water main replacement project and stated that the project was completed on time and on budget, costing \$315,000. He stated that water main work is complete; however, Smithcorp, Inc. will remain on site for yard and pavement restoration and site cleanup.

**Background:**


The property is located in the Stockton Station Planned Unit Development that was approved in 1999. The site is designated for commercial uses.

ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 166-84, THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF FAIRFIELD, OHIO, SECTION 1141.02, THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD, OHIO, ZONING MAP BY APPROVING THE FINAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE STARBUCKS AS A PART OF THE STOCKTON STATION PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fairfield, Ohio, that:

Section 1. Construction Award for Route 4, South Gilmore & Holden Intersection Improvements (ODOT PID 92552).

**FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

\$2,235,185 from the Street Improvement Fund (\$2,056,329 plus \$10,322 in alternates and a contingency of \$168,535 ). The ODOT Safety Grant will reimburse up to \$1,745,185 for construction with the City being responsible for \$490,000.00.

**SYNOPSIS:**

It is necessary for City Council to authorize the City Manager to award a construction contract for the Route 4, South Gilmore & Holden Intersection Improvement Project. The City has completed engineering and right of way acquisition for this project.

Along Holden/Gilmore, the project will begin south of the intersection of Parkland Hills Drive/South Gilmore and go north to the intersection of Port Union/North Gilmore/Holden. Work on Route 4 will be limited to advanced intersection signage and minimal pavement work near the intersection.

**BACKGROUND:**

The intersection of Route 4 and Holden/South Gilmore is consistently one of the most dangerous in the City in terms of accidents and resulting injuries. Contributing to this is the fact that the intersection is perpetually over capacity. Congestion at this intersection also creates capacity and accident issues at adjacent intersections along Holden/South Gilmore, particularly Parkland Hills Drive and Holden/North Gilmore/Port Union. This project will address these capacity and safety issues by making a number of improvements.

Holden will be widened to include a second thru lane to South Gilmore while South Gilmore will be widened to accept a second lane of traffic headed southbound. South Gilmore will also be widened to include a second, and longer, left turn lane onto northbound Route 4. In addition to this road work, the intersection will be upgraded to the mast arm style with illuminated advanced lane use signs and the entire intersection will be resurfaced.

The project is programmed in the current 2016-2020 CIP as PWA-16-101. ODOT funding for engineering and right of way was approximately 90% of eligible costs and the City's portion was approximately 10%.

Plans and specifications were advertised for bid on February 5, 12, and 19. A public bid opening was held on March 8, 2016. Three (3) bids were received, opened and publicly read. The lowest and best bidder was the John R. Jurgensen Company.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that City Council approve legislation for an appropriation in the amount of \$2,235,184.60 from the Street Improvement Fund.

It is also recommended that City Council direct the preparation of legislation authorizing the City Manager to enter into a contract with John R. Jurgensen for this project.

A suspension of rules is being requested so that the City will be able to enter into a contract with John R. Jurgensen within the timeframe stipulated by the State of Ohio for the grant.





**SYNOPSIS:**

This request is for the purchase of a International 2017 7400 SFA 4X2 (SA525) single axle truck cab and chassis from Rush Truck Centers, 11775 Highway Drive, Cincinnati, Oh 45241. This unit will be outfitted with dump bed and snow removal equipment under a separate contract. This vehicle is listed under O.D.O.T. Bid #023-15 with permission of use granted by The Ohio Revised Code section 5513.01(B).

**BACKGROUND:**

This truck will be used in day to day operations by the Street Division for snow removal and hauling. The current truck is a 1997 International dump truck (Unit #20) which is being retired from frontline use due to age and condition. Unit #20 will be transferred to the Parks Department to meet their seasonal needs and the Parks Department Unit #4 will be auctioned this year. This yearly rotation allows the Parks Department use of a retired Street Department truck for a year with little to no investment.

**RECOMMENDATION:**


It is recommended that the City Council authorize and direct the preparation of legislation authorizing the appropriation of funding in the amount of \$ 86,547 for this project.


