LEGISLATION SUMMARY NO. 12-2009

Following is a summary of legislation adopted by the Fairfield City Council on July 13, 2009. A complete text may be viewed at the following Fairfield locations: Fairfield Municipal Building (Room 138), Fairfield Lane Public Library, Fairfield YMCA, Fairfield Community Arts Center, and the Wildwood Manor House.

- Ord. 95-09 Option and lease agreement with Cricket Communications Inc. for an antenna on the Winton Road Water Tower.
- Ord. 96-09 Inter-local agreement with Butler County and other agencies for the distribution of Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funds.
- Ord. 97-09 Contract with Trend Construction for the replacement of the Resor Road pressure reducing station.
- Ord. 98-09 Contract with CJ&L Construction for the Fair Plaza Center demolition and retention pond plan.
- Ord. 99-09 Grant application and agreement with Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) for financial assistance for the Bypass 4 Improvement Project.
- Ord. 100-09 One (1) year contract with Kneisel Contracting Corporation for the 2009 Application of Roadway Pavement Markings Program.
- Ord. 101-09 2009 Budget Amendments: \$90,000 roadway pavement marking program; \$335,125 Fair Plaza Center demolition and construction of retention pond; \$330,000 Fair Plaza Center demolition and construction of retention pond; \$108,500 replacement of Resor Road pressure reducing station.
- Ord. 102-09 2009 Budget Amendments: \$24,500 replace computer network switch; \$8,000 external storage for e-mail server; \$20,200 for 911 mapping software; \$17,100 Memorial Park walkway; \$8,800 energy efficiency upgrades; \$57,910 additional work for Seward Road widening; \$67,080 additional funds for the Central Traffic System; \$13,000 painting of biosolids building; and \$15,000 re-roofing of filter buildings.
- Ord. 103-09 2009 Budget Amendment (Reconcile Account): \$250,000 refunds.
- Res. 9-09 Resolution withdrawing the City of Fairfield's previous objections to the renewal and transfer of the Cardis Entertainment, LLC liquor permit.
- Res. 10-09 Resolution declaring eleven (11) city vehicles as surplus and authorizing the City Manager to sell them through Flexco Fleet Services.
- Res. 11-09 Resolution adopting the tax budget of the City of Fairfield, Ohio, for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2010 and submitting the same to the Butler County Auditor.
