City's annual drinking water quality report is online!

Fairfield's Water Division recently published the City's Consumer Confidence Water Quality Report for 2021.

All utility customers received information about the annual report and how to access it on their recent water bills. Hard copies of the report are also available at the City Building at 5350 Pleasant Avenue. The report contains important information about the source and quality of Fairfield's water.

Fairfield is required to test its water regularly to ensure its safety. In 2021, Fairfield's drinking water met all federal and state standards as established by the U.S. and Ohio Environmental Protection Agencies. At no time did testing find contaminants exceeding acceptable levels.

Fairfield Planning & Zoning Code Update – Citizen Input

This past spring the City has been busy drafting new code language for the Planning and Zoning Code update. Specifically, the City has been focusing on updating definitions, categorizing uses and developing standards associated with the uses. You can view and comment on this draft section of the code by visiting www.fairfieldzoning.com.

The Planning and Zoning Code is the City's primary tool to guide development throughout the community. It sets standards

as to how land can be used such as placement of a building on a lot, how tall a building can be, and the type of signage that can be used to advertise a business. It also addresses the design of new subdivisions in terms of roadway layout, lot size and drainage.

The update will look at making the code more user friendly by updating

existing terminology, improving the overall organization, incorporating tables and graphics, and expanding design guidelines throughout the City where appropriate.

Business Booster

FISHER PARK EXPANDING

The former General Motors Fisher Body facility, now known as Fisher Park, continues to see new investment. Plymouth Industrial REIT, owner of the facility since 2019, is adding a new 150,000 square foot industrial building to the complex, pictured above. Construction is underway for the new building, which will be located along Route 4 between the main Fisher Body building and the CSX railroad tracks to the north. The building will provide modern industrial space for one or multiple companies and improve the aesthetics of the Route 4 corridor. Completion and occupancy of the building is anticipated in early 2023.

Guanacos Cafe Opens

Congratulations to Guanacos Café and Pupuseria, a new family owned restaurant located at 500 Kolb Drive near Bob Evans. The restaurant brings a taste of Salvadorian food to the Fairfield area, featuring pupusas, tamales, quesadillas, and other authentic homemade items. Several American staples are also featured. Guanacos is open for breakfast, lunch, and dinner Tuesday through Sunday, and closed on Mondays. Dine-in and carry-out options are available.

Jungle Jim's Gaining Restaurant

A new option for foodies is coming to the Jungle Jim's International Market complex. Pho Cincy, a Vietnamese Pho and Banh Mi restaurant, will be located between Hallmark and Petland facing Route 4. Vietnamese will be a nice complement to the international flair of the Route 4 corridor, which boasts restaurants serving up African, Chinese, Indian, Italian, Mexican, Nepalese, Peruvian, Thai, and other international foods.



Fairfield Career Fest Connects Students and Companies

Before the end of the 2021-22 school year, multiple community partners came together to expose Fairfield High School students to career opportunities in the Fairfield area. Known as "Fairfield Career Fest," the inaugural one-day event featured nearly 50 area companies with interactive exhibits in the Fairfield High School Arena.

Approximately 1,500 juniors and seniors visited with companies throughout the school day. Companies highlighted both near-term job opportunities that students could seek for the summer or immediately upon graduation, as well as future career opportunities that may require additional training, education, or experience to attain.

The event was presented by the Fairfield Chamber of Commerce in partnership with Fairfield City Schools, the City of Fairfield, the Fairfield Community Foundation, and Ohio Means Jobs Butler County.

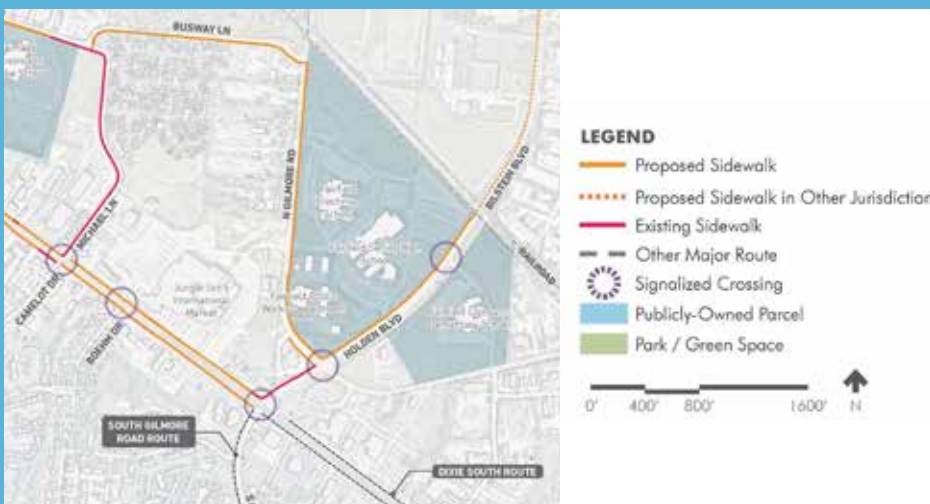

High School Campus Sidewalks Coming Soon

Next school year, students at the Fairfield Freshmen and High Schools will have new sidewalks. Over the summer, the City will be building a sidewalk between the two schools along Holden and North Gilmore. Completion of this sidewalk will connect the schools to Route 4 and South Gilmore. The need for the sidewalk has long been known and it gained momentum after the adoption of the Fairfield Connects plan in 2020.

Hendy, Inc., the City's contractor, will build the sidewalk for \$145,372, funded almost entirely by the federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. Future CDBG funds have been secured by the City to build additional sidewalk in the Dixie North area in the coming years.

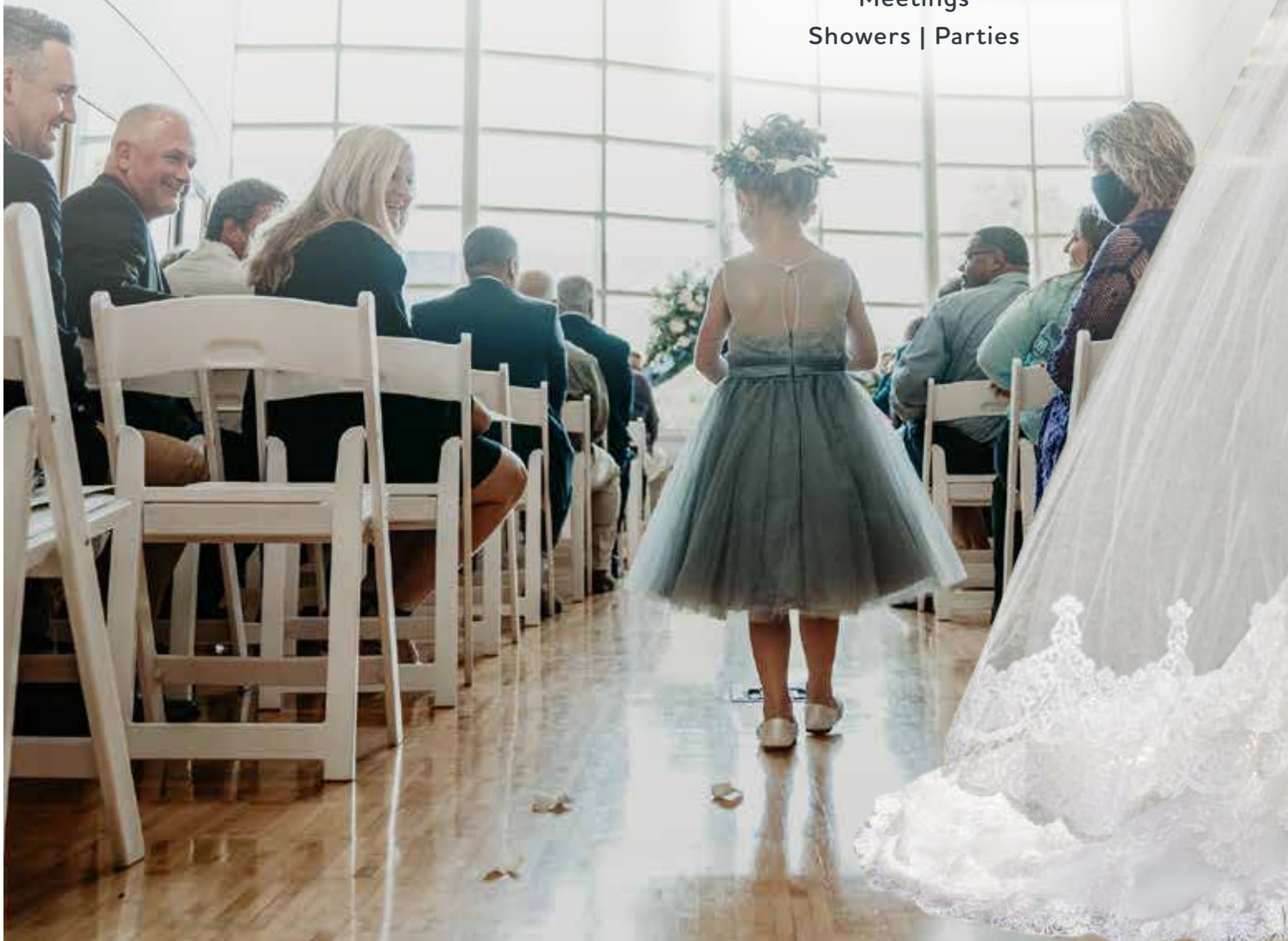
