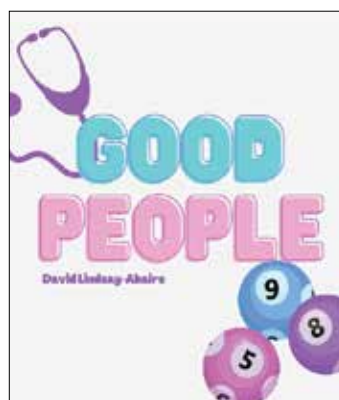
AND THEN THERE WERE NONE

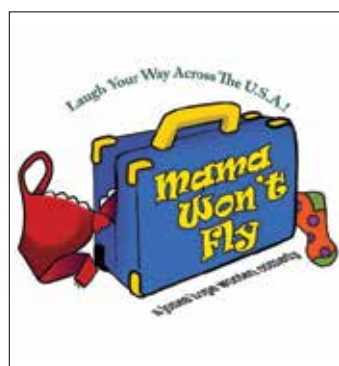

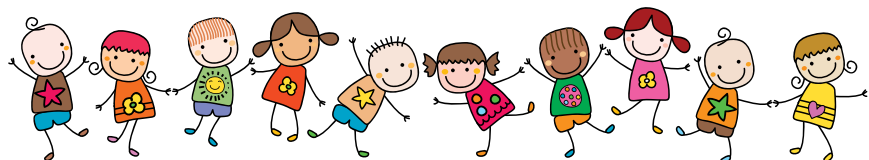


