CITY OF FAIRFIELD 2022 INCOME TAX FILING INFORMATION

Filing deadlines: The filing due date for 2022 individual and business returns is April 18, 2023. The deadline for individual and business returns filing on extension has not changed and remains October 15, 2023. Please attach a copy of the Federal Extension with your Fairfield return to avoid any delay in processing and/or penalty from charging in error. Federal Extensions do not extend the due date of the payment. All tax due payments as well as the first quarter estimates are due April 18, 2023.

Extended hours: The City will offer extended hours for the 2023 tax season. The tax office located at 701 Wessel Drive will remain open until 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday between April 3 through April 18, 2023. The tax office will also be opened Saturdays, April 1 & 15, 2023 between the hours of 9:00 a.m.- 1:00 p.m.

Mandatory filing: The City of Fairfield has mandatory filing for all residents 18 to 65 years old with or without taxable income. All residents over the age of 65 with taxable income, all property owners, and all businesses that are located in and/or doing business in the City of Fairfield must file.

Forms available: Individual, corporate, and employer filing forms are available in the forms section of the Income Tax Division website at www.fairfield-city.org/213/Income-Tax-Division. Forms are also available in the lobby of the Income Tax Office located at 701 Wessel Drive.

Required documents: All Fairfield returns must include a Federal 1040 with any applicable schedules and W2's to be considered complete. Failure to submit the required documents can lead to a review of the account.

Filing assistance: The City of Fairfield offers free filing assistance to all taxpayers; no appointment is necessary. Simply bring your required documents to the tax office located at 701 Wessel Drive during normal business hours (Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.).

Penalty and interest rates: Effective January 1, 2023, the penalty rate for late payment of taxes is 15%. Employer withholding payments not received timely will be subject to a penalty rate of 50%. The interest rate for tax year 2022 is 5%. The late file penalty is \$25 per month not to exceed \$150.

Hit Promotional Expands to Fairfield



the company previously leased space in Springdale and West Chester Township totaling 250,000 square feet. The new consolidated location in Fairfield Commerce Park offers the company 350,000 square feet.

Profill Solutions, a sister operation that provides procurement and fulfillment services for promotional products and apparel, is co-located at the new facility. The larger space allows both firms to grow and add to existing employment levels, which are currently estimated at 150 employees.

Dunkin' Coming to Town Center

Plans are underway to add a second standalone Dunkin' restaurant in Fairfield. The new restaurant is proposed for construction on Nilles Road in the current location of the Sushi House Asian Grill. Some may remember this site as a former Pizza Hut location. When complete, the new building is expected to have a similar appearance to the Dunkin' recently constructed in front of Meijer on South Gilmore Road.

Bell Moving & Storage, a full-service moving company on Port Union Road celebrated 100 years in business in 2022. To commemorate the occasion, Mayor Rhodus presented a proclamation to the company at the January 23, 2023 meeting of Fairfield City Council.

Fairfield FYI

Fairfield FYI is designed to allow Fairfield residents to quickly and easily request assistance for City services or report non-emergency issues from their smartphones or other mobile devices. The goal of the app is to build a strong relationship with residents and amplify the resident focused service model all City departments strive to uphold.

The three steps to report an issue or make a request:

- 1 Upload or take a picture in the app.
- 2 Choose the location associated with the issue or request.
- 3 Provide details related to the issue or request



By downloading Fairfield FYI, residents not only have the resources they want but they are also opening a two-way conversation with the City. The City can provide notices and updates regarding specific issues or location specific concerns, such as leaf collection or street closures, in addition to prompt attention to the requests submitted.

The City is wrapping up a nearly two-year-long process to update the Planning & Zoning Code. This code will help guide development in the City over the

coming decades. It is anticipated that the revised code will be adopted by City Council this summer. To learn more about the proposed changes and to submit comments, please visit www.fairfieldzoning.com. Public comments are still welcomed and encouraged as final code drafts are completed.



Great Miami River Trail

In 2022, the City was able to leverage Clean Ohio Funding to acquire 5742 River Road, adjacent to the intersection with Groh Lane. The residential buildings were demolished, invasive vegetation removed, and intersection sight distance improved. A new wayfinding sign for Waterworks Park was added to replace the old one, which also created a sight distance issue. Additionally, a 10' wide multiuse trail was paved across the property. This trail will one day be a part of the Great Miami River Trail that currently ends at Waterworks Park and is anticipated to continue through Fairfield into Hamilton County and eventually to the Ohio River.

The full project cost was \$233,682 with \$175,261 provided by the Ohio Public Works Commission.



Tall Grass? Let the City Know

Spring rains and warmer temperatures bring the start of the grass-growing season. The City of Fairfield has an ordinance requiring that the grass must be mowed to a height of less than 8 inches.

If you see a property that has tall grass and weeds, or looks like it has been abandoned, please report it to the Building & Zoning Division. For your assistance and confidentiality, the City has created a Property Maintenance Hotline at 513-867-5321 or PropertyMaintenance@FairfieldOH.gov, or you can use the Fairfield FYI app.

During business hours, you can talk directly with an inspector.

After hours, you can leave a message which will be addressed the next day. In most cases, the property owner will remedy the issue after being contacted by the City. If the property owner does not remedy the issue in a timely manner, the City can initiate legal action that allows it to step in and address the issue.



Police Department Awarded CALEA® Accreditation



On November 19, 2022 Deputy Chief Greg Valandingham and Officer Brian Rednour represented our Police Department at the quadrennial review for CALEA® re-accreditation (Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc.). At the conclusion, the Commission awarded our Police Department its 7th consecutive accreditation award.

Basic accreditation (Tier 1) consists of compliance with 180 applicable standards. Advanced accreditation (Tier 2) requires compliance with 458 applicable standards. The Fairfield Police Department is a Tier 2 agency.

The Fairfield Police Department also received the *Meritorious Award* and the *Excellence Award*.

Award Criteria

Meritorious Award

CALEA accredited agencies are recognized for having been accredited for 15 or more continuous years.

Accreditation with Excellence Award

The intent of the CALEA® Accreditation with Excellence Award is to provide agencies an opportunity to be further recognized for the effective use of accreditation as a model for the delivery of enhanced public safety services and management professionalism.

In total, 67 agencies were reviewed during this conference and the Fairfield Police Department was the sole recipient of the Excellence Award.

This was evident to the assessment team as it examined the outcomes of the agency’s systems and processes, as prescribed by CALEA standards, which have been in place for over fifteen years”.






