Where does our drinking water come from?

Following the devastating train derailment and chemical release in East Palestine, Ohio in February, the City fielded numerous calls about the incident and its potential impact on the safety of Fairfield's drinking water. Be assured – Fairfield's drinking water was, and remains, completely unaffected by this incident. Important information about Fairfield's drinking water is listed below:

Where does our drinking water come from?

We pump our drinking water from deep underground out of the Great Miami Buried Valley Aquifer. We own and operate six raw water wells that supply water to our Water Treatment Plant.

How big is the Great Miami Buried Valley Aquifer? What is it made of?

The Aquifer extends from north of Dayton, Ohio to near Lawrenceburg, Indiana – generally following the course of the Great Miami River. The aquifer is comprised of sand and gravel deposits, completely saturated with water, which stores over 1,500,000,000,000 gallons of water.

Is our water supply connected to the Ohio River? Will a spill on the Ohio River impact our water?

No – the groundwater we pump from the aquifer is not physically connected to the Ohio River. A chemical spill into the Ohio River has no impact on our drinking water.

Will we ever run out of groundwater?

Routine water level monitoring since the 1940's indicates that regional

water levels are mostly flat or slightly increasing. Generally speaking there is no risk of the aquifer going dry. The City of Fairfield is fortunate to have abundant water resources - which is why there are three water plants located in the City! Protecting the quality of this invaluable aquifer is one of the most critical things we as a City can do.

How do we treat our water?

The City softens the raw water to remove excess minerals (Calcium and Magnesium), adjusts the pH of the water to ensure its stability, filters it, disinfects it with chlorine, and then adds a small amount of fluoride to the water to promote tooth health.

How often is our water tested?

City staff members run hundreds of water quality tests each week. Tests continue to confirm the high quality and safety of our drinking water.
