Riegert Square Project Moving Forward

The commercial strip on the east side of Pleasant Avenue spanning roughly from Lindenwald Station to Little Caesars Pizza is commonly known as Riegert Square. Although it may appear to be one development, Riegert Square was constructed in multiple pieces by different owners between the mid-1960s and late-1970s and remains in separate ownership.

In 2021, the City completed a study that looked at vehicle crash data along Pleasant Avenue from 2017-2019. The study noted the high number and improper alignment of driveways, which results in multiple conflict points and increases the complexity of safely driving through the corridor.

Following completion of the study, the City began meeting with the property and business owners within Riegert Square. The result was consensus to complete a project to consolidate driveways, upgrade signage, and improve the overall aesthetics of Riegert Square.

Fairfield City Council committed a portion of the City's allocation of federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to support Riegert Square improvements, which are expected to cost \$1.25 million. Construction is now underway and major completion is expected before the end of the year.

Once complete, the 15 current access points from Pleasant Avenue will be consolidated to four major driveways. The City plans to install improved sidewalks, landscaping, pedestrian lighting, and new ground signs parallel to Pleasant Avenue, creating a greatly-improved streetscape. This project is expected to make Fairfield's Town Center safer for automobiles and pedestrians, as well as a healthier location for business and job growth.

TROPICAL SMOOTHIE CAFÉ COMING TO ROUTE 4

A smoothie chain with roots to the panhandle of Florida is coming to the Route 4 corridor. The new shop will be located at 6775 Dixie Highway in the small shopping plaza located between Starbucks and Caruso's, just south of Seward Road. Tropical Smoothie Café is well-known for

smoothies, but the shop also has a full menu of food including sandwiches, flatbreads, wraps, bowls, and breakfast items.

The Fairfield location is owned by Roma and Suresh Patel, former Fairfield residents who operate nearly 20 locations throughout the Cincinnati region.

New Shops Open at Cornerstone Plaza

Shoppers now have two new stores to explore in Cornerstone Plaza, the shopping center at the corner of Route 4 and Magie Avenue. Earlier this year, Open Box Outlet cut the ribbon on a new store in the main anchor tenant space after relocating from Tri-County Mall. One of five locations in the Cincinnati area, the store is family-owned and features overstock furniture, home décor, and other items.

In May, local officials gathered again to mark the opening of Sberna in the same shopping center. The store offers discount designer clothing and goods for the home. Store owner Ashley Osborne describes the store as similar to a TJ Maxx as it features many of the same brands and product lines.



WINGS & RINGS UNDERGOES RENOVATION

Located at Jungle Jim's, Fairfield's Wings & Rings restaurant recently completed renovations. Customers will notice a refreshed dining room and significant improvements were also made to expand the kitchen for improved efficiency. Updated signage and branding were also implemented during the project, which involved closing the restaurant for several weeks.

Known as Buffalo Wings and Rings until 2021, the Wings and Rings restaurant chain is based in Cincinnati and has more than 50 locations nationally. The Fairfield franchise is owned by Nadia David and Ramey Assaf and has been in operation for 18 years.

PROTECT FAIRFIELD'S STREAMS: POOL WATER BEST PRACTICES

Water from swimming pools and hot tubs often contain high levels of chlorine. Discharging chlorinated pool or hot tub water into streams (or drainage ways, ponds, etc.) is harmful to fish and other aquatic life. Fairfield Public Works partnered with savelocalwaters.org to provide you with management practices that will minimize the impact of chlorinated water discharged from swimming pools and hot tubs. The following 'Best Handling Practices' apply to water discharged from swimming pools, hot tubs, or other chlorinated waters.

POOLS AND HOT TUBS HAVE TWO TYPES OF WATER:

Backwash water is the waste product produced by cleaning a filter through a method of reversing the flow of water inside the filtration system.

Pool/hot tub water is the water in your pool or hot tub that is normally treated with chlorine.

WHAT DO I DO WITH BACKWASH WATER?

Filter backwash water contains pollutants and must be discharged to the sanitary sewer, not a storm drain. Sanitary sewers are specifically designed to transport wastewater to an appropriate treatment facility.

CAN POOL/HOT TUB WATER BE DIRECTED TO A STORM DRAIN OR SANITARY SEWER?

Do not discharge chlorinated water from your pool or hot tub into a storm drain. Discharging chlorinated water into the sanitary sewer is also generally not an option. If necessary, Fairfield Public Utilities can be contacted for special permitting.

CAN POOL WATER BE RELEASED ON THE OWNER'S LAND?

Chlorinated water from pools and hot tubs may be disposed of on the ground or irrigated on your property under the following circumstances:

- *Prior to disposing or irrigating the water, either shut off the chlorination system or stop adding chlorine, depending on your situation.*
- *Hold the water in the pool or hot tub for at least two days to allow the chlorine to dissipate. Up to two full weeks may be necessary for the complete dissipation of the chlorine.*
- *The pH (measure of acidity) of the dechlorinated water must be at least 6.5, but not greater than 8.5. The pH must be measured with a standard swimming pool water pH test kit.*
- *Discharge or irrigate the water in an area where the water will not flow into a stream, drainage way, or storm sewer.*
- *Discharge or irrigate the water on your property and ensure that it does not flow off of your property.*
- *Discharge or irrigate the water in a manner that will prevent nuisance conditions (such as creation of odors, and fly and mosquito breeding conditions). Nuisance conditions often occur when water is ponded for a prolonged period.*

CITY'S ANNUAL DRINKING WATER QUALITY REPORT IS ONLINE!

Fairfield's Water Division recently published the City's Consumer Confidence Water Quality Report for 2022. It is available online at: www.fairfieldoh.gov/2022waterqualityreport

All utility customers received information about the annual report and how to access it on their recent water bills. Hard copies of the report are also available at the Municipal Building at 5350 Pleasant Avenue. The report contains important information about the source and quality of Fairfield's water.

Fairfield is required to test its water regularly to ensure its safety. In 2022, Fairfield's drinking water met all federal and state standards as established by the U.S. and Ohio Environmental Protection Agencies. At no time did testing find contaminants exceeding acceptable levels.

Fairfield Career Fest Returns for Second Year



The second-annual Fairfield Career Fest event returned to Fairfield High School before the end of the 2022-23 school year. The one-day event featured nearly 50 area companies and educators with interactive exhibits, all with a goal to expose students to career opportunities in the Fairfield community. Approximately 1,500 juniors and seniors visited with companies throughout periods of the school day.

Companies highlighted both near-term job opportunities that students could seek for the summer or immediately upon graduation, as well as future career opportunities that may require additional training, education, or experience to attain. The students were highly-engaged and learned about careers across a variety of industries, including manufacturing, financial services, healthcare, and public service.

ADOPTION

Planning & Zoning Code

The City is entering the final stage of a nearly two-year long process to update the Planning & Zoning Code. This code will help guide development in the City over the coming decades by setting standards and guidelines as to how land can be utilized. It is anticipated that the revised code will be adopted by City Council this fall. To learn more about the proposed changes and submit comments, please visit www.fairfieldzoning.com. Public comments are still welcomed and encouraged as the City moves through the adoption process.

Keep Your Sidewalks Clear

Have you recently been out enjoying a walk in your neighborhood when you encountered a sidewalk blocked by low hanging tree branches or over-grown shrubbery? Have you stumbled over a large clump of grass growing in a sidewalk crack? Is a car parked over the sidewalk nearly every evening? If so, please report these obstacles to the City's Zoning Division.

Fairfield Codified Ordinances require that vegetation be maintained to provide unimpeded pedestrian access on public sidewalks. Trees and shrubs should be trimmed to provide at least six feet of clearance above the sidewalk.

Sidewalks should be edged regularly and grass in any cracks should be trimmed or sprayed so a clear and passable path is maintained at all times. This is particularly important for residents in wheelchairs, those pushing baby strollers, or kids riding bicycles.

Additionally, cars parked in driveways cannot block a public sidewalk. Occasionally, people have guests over and may need additional parking. This should not be a regular occurrence, however, since it blocks the public right-of-way.

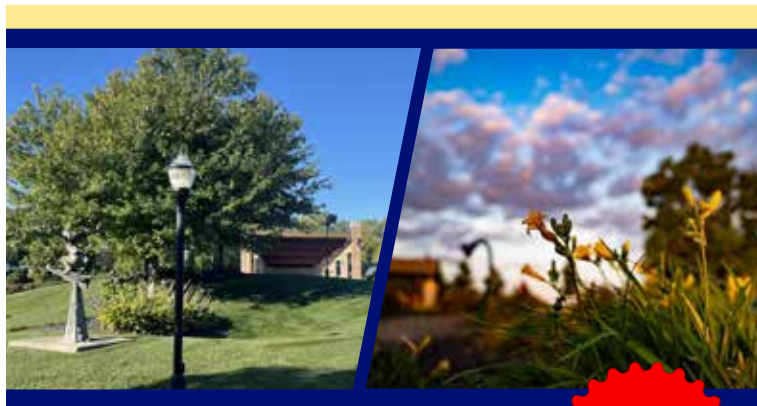

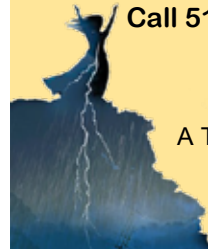

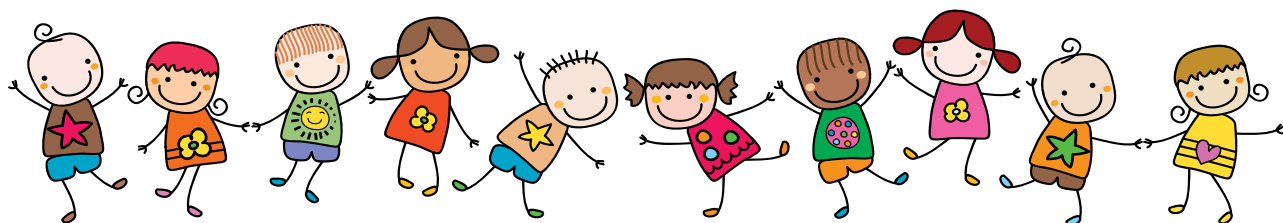
