Fairfield Discard Day Announced

FAIRFIELD – The City of Fairfield will hold its first Discard Day at the Fairfield Aquatic Center, located at 2605 Augusta Blvd., on October 22, 2022 from 10am – 2pm. The City has partnered with Butler County Recycling & Solid Waste District, Habitat for Humanity Restore, Goodwill Industries, and Junk King of Cincinnati to not only provide disposal for unwanted items, but also avenues to recycle or reuse those items.

The partnerships forged for this event provide many options for sustainable disposal of unwanted items. Habitat for Humanity Restore and Goodwill Industries will have donations trucks taking the items that can be sold in their stores. Junk King of Cincinnati will sort the items placed into the dumpsters to ensure they are reused, recycled or donated if possible. It has been a team effort to provide as many services for reducing, reusing, recycling, and discarding items properly.

The following items may be discarded: junk and debris, yard waste, accessories, working appliances, architectural items, bed frames, headboards, functional blinds, books, cabinets, countertops, media, ceiling fans, clothing, CRT monitors, doors, e-waste, electrical supplies, electronics, flooring, furniture in good condition, lumber, linens, paperwork, prescriptions, shoes, tools, TVs, and windows.

The following items will not be accepted: hazardous materials, shingles, concrete, motor oil, oil-based paint, fire extinguishers, antifreeze, gasoline, pesticides, fertilizer, solvents, thinners, fluorescent bulbs, lawn or pool chemicals, explosives, ammunition, broken appliances, and tires.

Many of the items not accepted at the Fairfield Discard Day can be properly disposed of through other events and offerings provided by Butler County Recycling & Solid Waste District. Those events can be found at www.butlercountyrecycles.org.
