SPECIAL BRUSH AND LIMB PICKUP

The City of Fairfield is pleased to announce that the Public Works Department will be doing a City-wide pick up of all brush and limbs due to the storm that came through the City.

All brush and limbs MUST be at the curb and ready for pick up by 7:00 a.m. on Monday, June 20. There will be no exceptions.

The following requirements have been established to ensure the safety and efficiency of this pick up. There will be no deviation from these requirements:

- ✓ Limbs must be **at least** six (6') feet in length and **no more than** six (6") inches in diameter and should be placed in the same direction. See below for disposal of larger limbs. Any limbs larger than 6" diameter will **not** be picked up. (Leave limbs as long as possible)
- ✓ Any smaller branches will be considered as brush and must be tied and bundled with natural fiber cord that is biodegradable (cotton, linen, or twine). Bundles tied with wire, plastic or nylon cord **will not be picked up**. All materials will be run through a chipper, so please ensure that there are no foreign objects, (i.e., metal, building materials, rocks, etc.) included as these could cause damage to the equipment or injury to those operating the equipment.
- ✓ Each bundle must not be heavier than 60 pounds and must be placed between the curb and sidewalk or at the edge of the roadway, not in the curb line or on the pavement. Placement of debris in the street is a traffic and safety hazard and is a violation of City Ordinance and will not be picked up by City personnel. Residents will be responsible for clean up and disposal. Do not park in front of piles. Piles that have blocked access or are obstructed by vehicles will not be picked up.
