

ANNUAL LEAF COLLECTION

Fairfield's annual leaf collection is scheduled to begin Monday, November 6, 2023. This program provides free leaf collection services to residents who place leaves in rows or piles between the curb and sidewalk or adjacent to the street in areas not having curbs and sidewalks.

Residents are advised not to place leaves in the street, as gutters and storm sewers can become blocked and cause localized flooding during moderate to heavy rainfall. Please help make the collection program run as smoothly as possible by raking your leaves between the curb and sidewalk, or in areas without curb, adjacent to the street. Also, please do not park in front of or near the piles between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. as the trucks/equipment cannot reach them, those piles will be left until the next scheduled collection week.

For the safety of our workers and the equipment, we also ask that residents not place grass clippings, sticks, or brush in with leaves.

Depending on weather and volume of leaves, crews may run a little bit behind schedule from time to time, but please have leaves raked to the curbside by the posted dates.

Notifications to residents will be provided with residents' utility bills, through social media, and on the City Website, <https://www.fairfield-city.org/434/Leaf-Collection>.

Residents who have a small amount of leaves, or who do not wish to participate in the program, may find it more convenient to bag their leaves and place them curbside for pick-up on the regular trash collection day.

ROUTE 4 TOY STORY

The first five years of business for The Toy Department have been a story of constant growth. The shop opened in a small storefront within Diplomat Village in early 2018, and relocated to a larger storefront in the same plaza just two years later. Earlier this year, the store made yet a third move to 5960 Dixie Highway, the former Queen City Harley Davidson dealership. With more than 7,000 square feet of showroom and a 20,000 square foot warehouse, the shop is one of the largest vintage toy retailers in the Midwest.



The Toy Department sells toys from the 1960s through today, including GI Joe, Star Wars, Transformers, X-Men, Star Trek, Barbies, Legos, MLB starting lineups, and much more.

Approximately 98% of the store's products are secondhand and purchased from collectors or estates, although some new toys are stocked.

The store is unique in that it does not ship its products. Toy collectors across the country follow the shop on Instagram, and it is not uncommon for a collector to travel from another state or country to make a purchase.



DSG-CANUSA

DSG-CANUSA COMING TO FAIRFIELD

More than 60 new manufacturing jobs are coming to Fairfield with the recent announcement of DSG-Canusa committing to occupy Building V at Fairfield Commerce Park. The company, a division of Mattr US Inc., is a manufacturer of integrated heat-shrink & cold-shrink tubing for industrial applications and serves a diverse set of markets, including automotive, electrical and utility, renewables, communications, aerospace and defense, and transportation. The new location will consolidate and expand operations currently located in Toronto, Ontario and Loveland, Ohio.

Fairfield Commerce Park is a five-building speculative business park located on nearly 140 acres along Seward Road. Development of the park began in 2020 following the acquisition of the former Liberty Mutual/Ohio Casualty campus by Ambrose Property Group. The completed development boasts 1.6 million square feet of Class A industrial space. All five buildings at the park are fully-leased, housing nine companies and hundreds of new jobs.

CASSANO'S PIZZA KING HONORED

One of the City's oldest operating businesses was recently honored during a milestone ownership transition.

Cassano's Pizza King opened on December 3, 1965 at 4761 Dixie Highway in what was then known as the Hicks Manor Shopping Center. The shop was the 27th location in the Cassano's chain that grew to American pizza dominance in the 1970s with locations throughout the country.

Today, the Fairfield location is one of only a few remaining independent franchises of Cassano's. The restaurant is located at the same address, although the surrounding shopping center has been significantly renovated and renamed to Cornerstone Plaza.

For more than 40 years, the Fairfield location was owned by Elaine Hill and her family. At the beginning of September, Mrs. Hill sold the restaurant to Katie Dixon and began a well-earned retirement. Fairfield City Council recognized the business with a special proclamation presented at the September 11th council meeting. Later that week, officials from the City and the Fairfield Chamber gathered at the restaurant for a royal ribbon cutting to rededicate this Fairfield institution.

Energy Aggregation Issues to Appear on November 7 Ballot in Fairfield – Here's What You Need to Know!

Fairfield City Council has decided to place energy aggregation issues on the November 7, 2023 ballot. Two separate issues will be placed on the ballot: one for natural gas and one for electric. If these issues pass, the City of Fairfield will register to become a certified aggregator with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO). This will allow city officials to negotiate utility rates for the electric and natural gas use for residents and small businesses that use Duke Energy Ohio.

City Council is committed to finding ways to stabilize utility costs for residents. Energy aggregation is a tool that local governments can use to give residents another option for the purchase of energy.

What is an Energy Aggregation Program?

Community electric and natural gas aggregation programs combine the residential and small business purchasing power of a larger "aggregated" group in pursuit of lowering and stabilizing energy prices.

Why are these Issues on the November 7 Ballot?

Electric and natural gas aggregation issues appear on the ballot by law. Voters must approve these issues prior to implementation of any program.

What does my YES vote mean?

A YES vote will allow City Council to complete the certification process through the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) and start the process to determine if electric and natural gas aggregation programs are a beneficial option to residents and small businesses.

What does a NO vote do?

A NO vote will not allow the City Council to explore the option of energy aggregation.

Will I save money on my utility bill?

The programs are designed to stabilize energy prices and save money. They provide security against volatile energy markets. Savings is always a priority but cannot be guaranteed. In most cases, residents will see a reduction in energy costs.

Will I have a separate bill?

No. You'll continue to get a single bill from Duke Energy.

If this passes, am I required to be in the program?

No, you will be able to participate if you wish, but can enter or leave the program at any time without any fees.

My electric is with Butler Rural Electric Cooperative, can I participate in the program?

No, only Ohio customers with an investor-owned utility (i.e. Duke Energy) are allowed to shop their electric rates.

Remembering Police K9 Koda


On August 14, 2023 the Fairfield Police Department suddenly and unexpectedly lost Police K9 Koda after he was diagnosed with an inoperable tumor. Koda has served as an invaluable member of the Fairfield Police Department since August of 2014.

For the last 9 years, Koda has worked alongside his handler, Officer John Vinskey. Officer Vinskey and Koda have been assigned to third shift for all 9 years and together, the duo made a formidable team that were a valuable asset in many areas of police work. The team was able to assist with the apprehension of subjects, drug detection and article retrieval. Fairfield Police Department along with surrounding law enforcement agencies, that would request assistance, were grateful for their services. Fairfield and local communities were safer as a result of Koda's service.

During his time serving on the department, Koda was very productive and an essential element to many investigations. Koda was used for drug sniffs, article searches, tracking wanted suspects as well as missing people. Over his career, Koda recorded 17 offender apprehensions by bite. He conducted 123 tracks with an average success ratio of 34%. Koda conducted over 300 drug sniffs on vehicles, which often resulted in the discovery of illegal narcotics and contraband.



Just like every dog that is loved by their owner, Koda has left memories on the hearts of the men and women of this department. Although he is gone, every time Officer Vinskey harnesses up his new partner and officers begin calling out their perimeter locations, Koda will be along for the track in spirit.



The men and women of the department knew Koda as intense but wild, highly energetic but focused when it was "time to work", extremely confident and determined. Nobody knew Koda better than Officer Vinskey, whose intimate knowledge of Koda's personality and tendencies allowed them to function as one unit. Officer Vinskey had this to say about his partner of 9 years. "Koda was truly a joy to be around, even until the end. Koda never lost his spirit".

When asked about a favorite on-duty memory, Officer Vinskey recalled a call for service where Koda was able to assist a neighboring jurisdiction with a track following a shooting. During the track, Koda was able to determine which residence the offender fled into. He also located and dug up the firearm used in the shooting, which had been buried and hidden under a bicycle. Officer Vinskey said he will forever miss the ear kisses through the pass through of his cruiser while patrolling.

While the officers Koda served with knew Koda the working dog, Officer Vinskey and his family got to know and love Koda, the family dog. At home, Koda was playful, loving, and gentle. When the family adopted a kitten (Callie), Koda and Callie immediately became best friends. Despite Koda's usually rambunctious and aggressive play, he was very gentle with Callie. Koda loved showing his affection with lots of kisses and would not miss an opportunity for bedtime cuddles.

This fall, Officer Vinskey will once again begin patrolling alongside a young, energetic, puppy-like K9. As K9 and officer get to know one another, one thing will be for certain - the memories and lessons Officer Vinskey and Koda taught one another will undoubtedly benefit Officer Vinskey's new partner, Kozmo.




