CITY OF FAIRFIELD 2023 INCOME TAX FILING INFORMATION

Who Needs to File:

- Residents between the ages of 18-65 (including part-year residents).
- Residents 65 years or older with taxable income.
- Businesses doing business in Fairfield.
- Employees working in Fairfield whose employer failed to fully withhold Fairfield taxes.
- Non-residents with income or losses from self-employment and/or rental property earned within the City limits.

When to File:

- Individuals and Business Net-Profit (excluding fiscal year filers) due **April 15, 2024**.
- Employer reconciliations due **February 29, 2024**.
- Please visit our website for details on extensions for time to file your return.

What is Needed to File:

Individuals

- Federal 1040 with any applicable schedules.
- W-2(s)
- Any additional supporting documentation.

Business Net-Profit Returns

- Completed business return.
- Federal Tax Return.
- Any supporting statements, schedules, or other documentation.

Employer Withholding Reconciliations

- Completed Fairfield Reconciliation form.
- Employee W-2(s) in electronic or paper format (see website for details).

WAWA TO REPLACE ROUTE 4 CAR LOT

The northwest corner of Route 4 and Symmes Road will see some big changes in the coming months as the Dixie Imports car lot is redeveloped into a new Wawa gas station and convenience store. The new Wawa will be one of the first locations of the chain to open in the region. Wawa is primarily based along the East Coast of the United States, and has announced plans to build multiple locations throughout the Cincinnati market.



Wawa began as a dairy company outside of Philadelphia, originally delivering milk and other dairy products to customer homes. In the 1960s, the company began operating food marts, which evolved into the modern convenience stores. Wawa is known for its robust food offerings, including made-to-order hot or cold hoagies.

The Route 4 & Symmes Wawa will occupy approximately 3.5 acres and feature 10 fuel pumps and a nearly 6,000 square foot convenience store. Much of the current site has pavement extending to the roadway. When redeveloped, the new site will include sidewalks and landscaping, greatly enhancing the visual appearance of the area. Other sites are under consideration for Wawa locations within Fairfield, including the corner of Tylersville Road and Bypass 4.



New Owners Continue Legacy at Bryan's Flowers

Bryan's Flowers, a 28-year staple at 1135 Magie Avenue, has new ownership. New owners Andy and Tricia Luckhaupt acquired the business upon the retirement of Tim and Sara Wietmarschen. Local officials, family members, and the Wietmarschens celebrated the ownership transition with a ribbon cutting in late 2023. The Luckhaupts look forward to continuing the legacy of Bryan's Flowers and have an eye towards growth, including plans for extending hours and expanding services in the future.



Hooterville Sports Cards Expanding

Established in 1993 by Kevin Ashcraft, Hooterville Sports Cards is a long-established business within Fairfield's Town Center area. In addition to sports cards, the shop offers a wide array of sports collectables and memorabilia, drawing customers from throughout the region.

The shop is expanding from its current storefront at 5102 Pleasant Avenue to a larger storefront at 5120 Pleasant Avenue, next to McKinley's Pub. The larger space will allow the shop to showcase more products and offer increased selection to customers.

Cincinnati Center for Autism Coming to Fairfield



The Route 4 corridor will become home to a leading non-profit agency in 2024. The Cincinnati Center for Autism (CCA) has purchased 100 Commercial Drive, a vacant office building located directly south of Furniture Fair. The agency is currently renovating the building and plans to relocate operations to Fairfield in the fall.

CCA supports individuals with autism through programming in the areas of academics, adaptive behavior, communication, and social participation. CCA serves clients from throughout Greater Cincinnati, including students of Fairfield City Schools. CCA was founded by a Fairfield father nearly two decades ago and currently operates in a former church building within the City of Springdale.

The relocation brings 60 new jobs to Fairfield, as well as additional growth potential for the organization. Fairfield City Council is supporting the project through a forgivable loan funded through a federal American Rescue Plan Act grant for Route 4 revitalization.

THE CITY'S NEWEST WATER TOWER NOW IN SERVICE!

Construction work is complete on the City's newest water tower – located on Port Union Road near Thunderbird Lane. The structure, called the Port Union Tank, was put into service in mid-October 2023. At 170 feet tall, it is the tallest of the City's six elevated water tanks. The concrete and steel tank holds 1,250,000 gallons of water. Landmark Structures from Fort Worth, Texas built the tank. The \$5.2 million project was financed by a loan secured from the Ohio Water Development Authority (OWDA); loan terms are 25 years at 3.17% interest.

The Port Union Tank is the first new water tank built in the City in over 25 years. The structure was constructed to meet the growing water demands of industrial customers on the east side of the City.

With six elevated water tanks, the City has the ability to store 8,250,000 gallons of water in its distribution system. Average daily water demand in the City is around 5,500,000 gallons.



2023 Route 4 Paving Improvements

This paving improvement project, included some minor widening, curb & median replacements where necessary, replacement of the majority of ground mounted and overhead signage, replacement of the intermediate and surface layers of asphalt, new pavement markings, and new raised pavement markers. The limits were from just south of the Interstate 275 bridge in Springdale to just south of Seward Road in Fairfield. Work was completed almost exclusively during night-time hours.

This project was funded through ODOT Urban Paving, Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC), and local funds from Fairfield and Springdale and was administered and inspected by the City of Fairfield's Construction and Engineering Division.

Tall Grass? Let the City Know

Spring rains and warmer temperatures bring the start of the grass growing season. The City of Fairfield has an ordinance requiring grass to be mowed to a height of less than 8 inches.

If you see a property that has tall grass and weeds, or looks like it has been abandoned, please report it to the Building & Zoning Division. For your assistance and confidentiality, the City has created a Property Maintenance Hotline at 513-867-5321 or PropertyMaintenance@FairfieldOH.gov or you can use the Fairfield FYI mobile app.

During business hours, you can talk directly with an inspector. After hours, you can leave a message which will be addressed the next business day.

In most cases, the property owner will remedy the issue after being contacted by the City. If the property owner does not remedy the issue in a timely manner, the City can initiate legal action that allows it to step in and address the issue.






