Ribbon Cutting at CrossFit Fairfield

CROSSFIT FAIRFIELD

The community has a new fitness option with the opening of CrossFit Fairfield. Located at 4761 Industry Drive, the new gym is owned by Fairfield resident Keith Knapp. Keith began his own CrossFit journey in 2008 and wants to bring the benefits of CrossFit to more people in the community. The gym offers multiple options for memberships, classes, and age groups.



State Grant Supports Industrial Development

NorthPoint Development is constructing a two-building industrial park located off Firebird Drive near our border with West Chester Township and the Miami-Erie Canal Trail. The development, known as Fairfield Trade Center, occupies 77 acres in Fairfield that was long thought to be undevelopable due to floodplain, wetland, and wet soil issues. A large earth moving project was necessary to create elevated building pads and large retention ponds.



In order to make the project financially viable, a \$1 million Ohio Site Inventory Program (OSIP) grant was awarded from JobsOhio, the state's non-profit economic development organization. City staff helped the developer identify and apply for the grant funds to ensure the project could move forward.

Construction of the buildings is nearing completion, bringing more than 600,000 square feet of modern industrial space to the market. The park is anticipated to attract a mix of light manufacturing, logistics, and distribution firms, creating new job opportunities for area residents.




CINCINNATI RADIATOR EXPANDING IN FAIRFIELD

Cincinnati Radiator, a well-established local company, has leased new space on Seward Road in Fairfield. The company designs, engineers, manufactures, and services heavy duty radiators and other cooling products that are used in a variety of industrial and large equipment applications. The new facility will allow the company to onshore manufacturing of radiator components that are currently sourced from overseas.

Currently located on Port Union Road on the Fairfield-Hamilton border, the company will initially occupy 75,000 square feet within Seward Point Commerce Park. Cincinnati Radiator is the first signed tenant in the industrial park, which offers 450,000 square feet of Class A industrial space located in two buildings accessible from both Symmes and Seward Roads.

Updated and Improved Zoning Code!

The much-anticipated comprehensive update to the Planning and Zoning Code was adopted by City Council in March and became effective in April. Organizational improvements to the Code include graphics, diagrams, and photos to help better understand key terminology and concepts as well as hyperlinks to assist in navigating the Code. Several recommendations from the Fairfield Forward Comprehensive Plan were implemented such as the creation of four overlay districts that have building design requirements. Other substantive changes include new landscaping requirements, introduction of lighting standards, reduction in parking minimums, encouragement of sustainable development practices, and an expansion of digital sign locations.



Public Works 2024 Asphalt Program

2024 Annual Overlay

The City's overlay program is an annual maintenance project that replaces deficient curb and resurfaces old pavement. Each year, streets are selected to be included in this project based on the current condition and age of the pavement. Residents, businesses, and motorists can expect temporary delays and closures as crews perform the necessary work.

This year's paving program received \$950,000 in funding from the Ohio Public Works Commission.

Brush & Limb Pickup

Every April to October, the Public Works Department provides a Call-in Brush and Limb Pickup Program to Fairfield residents. Residents wishing to have brush and limbs picked up can arrange to do so by contacting the Public Works Department at least one week in advance of the scheduled pickup week for your area (see below).

Pickup Schedule

The three pickup areas will be the same as those used for the City's leaf pickup program.



- The first week of each month - areas west of Pleasant Avenue (U.S. 127).
- The second week of each month - areas between Pleasant Avenue and Winton Road.
- The third week of each month - areas east of Winton Road.

Pleasant Run Creek Restoration Project

The City of Fairfield received a grant from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency to develop a strategic plan that would identify restoration options for a section of the Pleasant Run Creek just south of Nilles Road adjacent to Creekside Park.

The City is interested in feedback from the community that may lead to restoration efforts should future funding opportunities become available.


REMEMBER & HONOR
