CITY'S ANNUAL DRINKING WATER QUALITY REPORT IS ONLINE!



Fairfield's Water Division recently published the City's Consumer Confidence Water Quality Report for 2023. It is available online at: www.fairfieldoh.gov/2023waterqualityreport.

All utility customers received information about the annual report and how to access it on their recent water bills. Hard copies of the report are also available at the Municipal Building at 5350 Pleasant Avenue. The report contains important information about the source and quality of Fairfield's water.

Fairfield is required to test its water regularly to ensure its safety. In 2023, Fairfield's drinking water met all federal and state standards as established by the U.S. and Ohio Environmental Protection Agencies. At no time did testing find contaminants exceeding acceptable levels.

New Charging Stations Coming Soon

The City of Fairfield has been approved for funding by the Ohio Kentucky Indiana Regional Council of Governments for the installation of electric vehicle charging stations at the Lane Library, Harbin Park, and Waterworks Park. OKI approved funding for \$126,945 in federal Carbon Reduction funds and Ohio Toll Revenue credits. This covers 100% of our estimated costs for this project. OKI is helping local communities awarded federal funding by supplying the 20% local match on our behalf.

Public Works will work with ODOT on the implementation and plans to start the project later this year and have them operational by late 2024, early 2025.

We'd like to recognize our City Engineer, Nick Dill for his efforts in putting this grant application together. Nick was also previously successful in getting a grant for the City's first public EV charging station at the Community Arts Center and for coordinating the installation.

Removing Dead Trees

For many years, Fairfield has taken pride in being designated as a Tree City USA community. The past few years have been difficult for trees in our area however. Between invasive insects, tree diseases, and the ever-worsening effects of climate change leading to extreme weather, many trees in our community are struggling to survive.

In public areas such as parks and public buildings, City crews trim or remove dead or dying trees. On private property, per the City's codified ordinances, it is the responsibility of property owners to have dead or dying trees removed.

Dead or dying trees are eyesores for individual properties and for the neighborhood at large. They can attract other insects and vermin, create negative curb appeal, and ultimately harm property values.

Dead trees also present serious safety concerns. Once a tree has died, it can quickly begin deteriorating and losing stability. When this occurs, it can pose a safety risk to property owners, neighbors, and visitors and a serious threat of damage to nearby property. These situations create significant liability concerns for property owners. Additionally, if the cause of tree death is invasive insects or tree disease, then leaving the dead tree on the property may promote the spread of tree insects or diseases to nearby healthy trees.

In some cases, trees that are struggling may be able to be saved with timely assistance from a landscaper or arborist. Waiting too long, however, will likely result in the need to remove it. The cost to remove a large dead tree can be high. Property owners are advised to plan ahead and prepare for this cost.


