



FLAVORS OF FAIRFIELD WINNERS CELEBRATED

Fairfield City Council recently recognized Kat Steele and Mike Jung, the grand prize winners in the Flavors of Fairfield International Dining Adventure. Mike and Kat were among 54 individuals that visited at least eight of Fairfield's international restaurants or bakeries during the Flavors of Fairfield promotion. Mike and Kat each won a \$1,000 gift card to Jungle Jim's International Market.

The inaugural launch of Flavors of Fairfield promotion generated nearly 900 visits to international eateries in Fairfield. Created to promote the many international restaurants and bakeries that call Fairfield home—including fare from Africa, China, India, Italy, Mexico, Nepal, Peru, Thailand, Vietnam, and more—the promotion featured 22 total eateries and attracted participants from around the Cincinnati region and beyond.

Eco Pac ribbon cutting ceremony

ECO PAC LAUNCHES FAIRFIELD OPERATIONS

A summer ribbon cutting marked the official opening of Eco Pac, a new business located on Donald Drive. The company specializes in the manufacture of flat-bottom paper bags, with a focus on sustainability. The women-owned business was founded by Yash Kunduru and her husband Sam Bandinani.

The sustainability focus means that the company is attempting to use only recycled materials in its products, as well as recyclable inks. With Amazon and Whole Foods as customers, the company will run tens of millions of paper bags annually. As plastics bags fall out of favor with some consumers and corporations, the paper bag industry is expected to see strong growth in the coming years.



Elbo Room Marks 60 Years in Fairfield

Few businesses can claim six decades in business. The Elbo Room on Magie Avenue is the exception. Opening in 1964, just a decade after the incorporation of Fairfield itself, the Elbo Room has long been a fixture in the community. Today the business is owned by Sandra Coffey and maintains a humble, welcoming atmosphere.

The Elbo Room has expanded its physical footprint to add a new room with pool tables and other interactive entertainment. The Fairfield Chamber of Commerce held a ribbon cutting to celebrate the anniversary and expansion of the business.



Mercy Health plans to expand its service offerings in the Fairfield community with a new urgent care facility. The new facility will be located at the Jungle Jim's International Market complex adjacent to the GE Credit Union and Jimmy John's. Construction of the new building is expected to be fully underway this year.

New Ladder Truck in Service

Fairfield Fire Department (FFD) received a brand-new and highly-anticipated addition to the fleet this May! Ladder 32 features a 100 foot aerial ladder and a 1,500 gallon per minute fire pump. The purchase price of this impressive truck was \$1.4 million, all of which was covered using American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant funding. This ladder truck will be placed in service at Firehouse 32 on Dixie Highway.



Retirements

Battalion Chief Tracy Donovan- After nearly 40 years of distinguished service to the Fairfield Fire Department, Battalion Chief Donovan retired in May 2024. BC Donovan was hired as one of the first Battalion Chiefs in the FFD and was committed to being a leader who was continuously growing, learning, and training. Battalion Chief Donovan's example is one that should resonate with young firefighters, and is a clear take-away that learning should never stop in the fire profession.

Battalion Chief Donovan plans to enjoy his retirement spending time with his wife and grandchildren.

Lieutenant Noah (Rick) Gibbs- Hired as one of the first career firefighters for the Fairfield Fire Department, Lieutenant Gibbs's leadership and engagement was integral in helping to form the foundation for FFD. Lt. Gibbs was an active member of the firefighting community who was involved with the Greater Cincinnati Hazardous Materials Unit, was a State Certified Fire Instructor and State Fire and Life Safety Inspector. Rick was responsible for and operated the Movie in the Park program for many years where he took advantage of the public gatherings to spread fire prevention information and education.

Lt. Gibbs retired in May 2024 as the most senior member of the Fairfield Fire Department after 41.5 years of service.

Fire Department Clerk Connie Minnick- Over the 20 years that Connie has been with Fairfield Fire Department, Connie has made herself an invaluable member who truly keeps the Fire Department running. Connie expertly manages budgetary procurements and expenditures, and her institutional knowledge of Fairfield city processes and community culture has been an essential key to FFD's success. Before working with FFD, Connie worked for the City of Fairfield from 1974-1976 before returning in 1994 as a Records Clerk with Fairfield Police Department. FFD has so appreciated Connie's service and dedication since 2004.

Promotions & New Positions Added

This Spring, FFD has undergone strategic restructuring of department ranks (adding the positions of **Captain** and **Fire Apparatus Operator (FAO)** to give employees room for career development, specialization, and upward growth, as well as providing further administrative support to the department. In addition to emergency responsibilities, a Captain coordinates operations and training, and tracks necessary equipment repair, updates, and supplies. Those promoted to the newly-established role of Fire Apparatus Operator are responsible for delivering the firefighters safely to the scene of the emergency and operating the fire apparatus. All FAOs will maintain all of their fire and EMS certifications and will be responsible for the overall maintenance and accountability of the fire apparatus.

Fire Prevention Week

Fire Prevention Week will be observed **October 6 to October 12, 2024**. The theme for Fire Prevention Week 2024 is **"Smoke Alarms: Make them work for you!"** Smoke alarms are critical pieces of safety equipment for your home that are proven to save lives. Nearly 60% of home fire deaths occur in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms. Keep yourself and your family protected by testing your smoke alarms to ensure that they work BEFORE a fire emergency arises.

It is so important to involve your family in emergency planning! Discuss a proper meeting place for your family to reunite in the case of a fire. Good examples of family meeting places include: the mailbox or a trusted neighbor's home. Another family preparedness tip is to make a home escape plan that meets the needs of all the members of the household. Consider the mobility of each member of the home and if they will be able to escape unassisted in the event of a fire. After you have discussed a plan, don't forget to practice!

Fairfield Fire Department will be helping educate school-aged children about the importance of fire safety, by conducting an annual Fire Prevention Poster Contest with Fairfield area schools. Check out our social media pages in mid to late October as we share some of our favorite posters!

FROM THE DESK OF THE CHIEF

Major changes are happening at Fairfield Fire Department and we are proud to share our growth and evolving professionalism with the community.

This summer, we welcomed three new employees to the department, all of whom will serve in the roles of firefighter and paramedic. Hiring employees with this dual certification is not only an important step towards enhancing medical care and ability to treat injuries on medical response calls, but will also strategically save funds that would be expended in overtime pay or in sending newly-hired employees to paramedic training.

In addition to improving services for residents, we are also committed to growing the workplace environment for our employees. The positions of Captain and Fire Apparatus Operator were created within the department, adding layers of career progression to FFD, with the goal of retaining quality firefighters who are constantly striving to further their professional career. Over the span of a few months, FFD celebrated fifteen well-earned promotions and three retirements of cherished FFD employees- providing FFD with the opportunity to honor the work of FFD employees who are moving on, by instilling a drive to move forward in proficiency.

"We are Family" is the mantra that FFD has adopted as a department - a bond that marries duty, dedication, and passion for service to the community. It is my hope and expectation that this outlook on the work of the Fire Department is reflected in all of our interactions with the public. -Chief Tom Lakamp

City of Fairfield Residential Tree Program

Let's work together to maintain Fairfield as a great
"Tree City" with a thriving urban forest.

The Residential Tree Program provides the City's home owners with a 50% co-pay, up to \$200, for a tree purchased from Meyer's Garden Center & Landscaping or Lakeview Garden Center & Landscaping.

GUIDELINES

- Tree must be purchased from Meyer's Garden Center & Landscaping (5072 Dixie Hwy) or Lakeview Garden Center & Landscaping (6061 Pleasant Ave).
- Tree must be planted on the resident's property or (if approved by the City) in the public right-of-way.
- An approved application is required prior to purchase to ensure that funds are available.
- Each property owner may request one tree per year.




