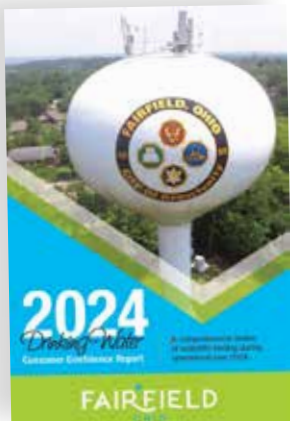

CITY'S ANNUAL DRINKING WATER QUALITY REPORT IS ONLINE!



Fairfield's Water Division recently published the City's Consumer Confidence Water Quality Report for 2024. It is available online at: www.fairfieldoh.gov/2024waterqualityreport

All utility customers received information about the annual report and how to access it on their recent water bills. Hard copies of the report are also available at the City Building at 5350 Pleasant Avenue. The report contains important information about the source and quality of Fairfield's water.

Fairfield is required to test its water regularly to ensure its safety. In 2024, Fairfield's drinking water met all federal and state standards as established by the U.S. and Ohio Environmental Protection Agencies. At no time did testing find contaminants exceeding acceptable levels.

Tall Grass? Let the City Know

Spring rains and warmer temperatures bring the start of the grass growing season. The City of Fairfield has an ordinance requiring grass to be mowed to a height of less than 8 inches. If you see a property that has tall grass and weeds, or looks like it has been abandoned, please report it to the Building & Zoning Division.

For your assistance and confidentiality, the City has created a Property Maintenance Hotline at 513-867-5321 or PropertyMaintenance@FairfieldOH.gov or you can use the Fairfield FYI mobile app. During business hours, you can talk directly with an inspector. After hours, you can leave a message which will be addressed the next business day.

In most cases, the property owner will remedy the issue after being contacted by the City. If the property owner does not remedy the issue in a timely manner, the City can initiate legal action that allows it to step in and address the issue.

REDI CINCINNATI RECOGNIZES PACIFIC MANUFACTURING AND SCHNEIDER ELECTRIC

At its annual meeting on March 6th, REDI Cincinnati, the regional economic development organization representing Greater Cincinnati, recognized five local businesses with James A. Wuenker Growth Awards. Growth Awards are given annually to projects announced in the previous year that significantly impacted the economic vitality of the Cincinnati region. Fairfield projects were awarded two out of the five awards, recognizing the significant expansions of Pacific Manufacturing and Schneider Electric.

Pacific Manufacturing Ohio, a tier-one auto parts manufacturer, was recognized for embarking on its ninth major expansion since beginning operations in Fairfield in 1990. This expansion, located at 550 Quality Boulevard, will add 96 new positions, bringing the total number of employees to nearly 1,000 within 3 years with a projected payroll of \$44.7 million annually. The total investment of the project exceeds \$70 million. This expansion will allow Pacific to better serve their clients including Toyota, Subaru, and Honda.

Schneider Electric, a Fortune Global 500 company, was also recognized for its two separate but related, significant expansions in Fairfield and Fairfield Township. The two projects represent a \$75 million investment, including new building construction, existing building renovations, and new machinery and equipment. Schneider will manufacture, service, and install sophisticated electrical components for data centers and other high-tech operations for customers around the world out of these two facilities.



O'Reilly Auto Parts Filling Route 4 Storefront

Construction is currently underway in Cornerstone Plaza for O'Reilly Auto Parts located at 4785 Dixie Hwy, previously home to Loman's Furniture. This new location will be approximately 35,000 square feet, offering ample space for a wide range of auto parts and supplies. Construction is anticipated to be completed before the end of summer 2025. This project will bring more retail options to the community and fill a large vacancy in the Route 4 corridor.

Bank of America Coming to Town Center



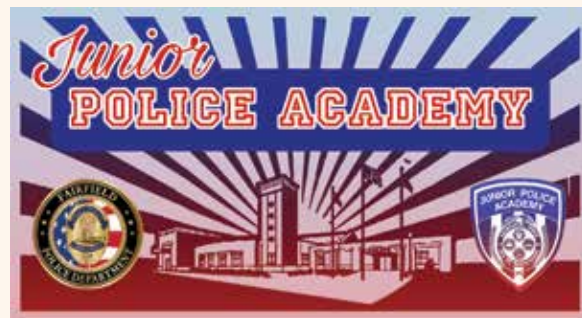
Bank of America plans for construction of a new branch located at 780 Nilles Road. The new facility will feature two drive-thru ATM lanes, offering added convenience for customers. The bank acquired and demolished an older office/commercial building located between Donatos and Strickland Brothers to create a development site. The development of this branch will provide additional banking services to residents and businesses in the area, further enhancing the local community's financial infrastructure.

Junior Police Academy

The mission of the Fairfield Police Department Junior Police Academy is to offer students an opportunity to experience the methods and techniques most often used in law enforcement. The program is best suited for students in 7th, 8th, or 9th grades for the 2025-2026 school year. 2024 Ross Road Sidewalk - *Cherryhill Drive to Cheryl*

Project Description

This project was designed to improve the pedestrian connectivity along Ross Road and complete a gap on Ross Road between Route 4 and Mack Road. The project included curb and storm sewer to separate the pedestrian traffic from vehicular traffic as much as practical. This project also included completing a gap in the sidewalk on Resor Road that required a small retaining wall.

This sidewalk connection was identified in the City's Active Transportation Plan and funded through local funds from the City of Fairfield's Street Improvement Fund and from Butler County's portion of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). This project was administered by the Public Works Department.

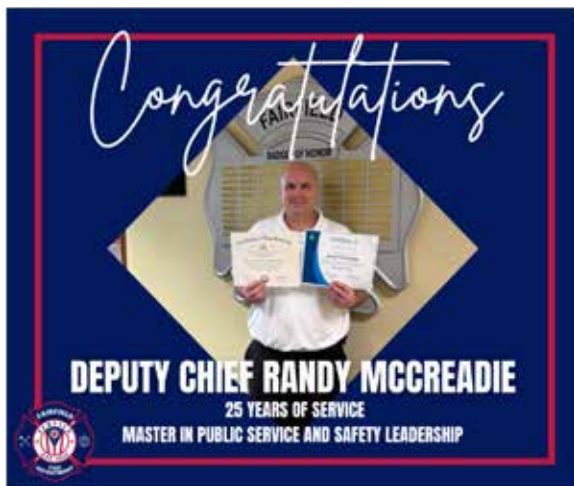

Ready to Respond

With Marsh Park nearby, FFD members jumped at the chance to train for emergency rescue situations involving ice, a training opportunity that only arises a few times a year! While the FFD was not called to assist any cold water rescues this winter, members were prepared and ready to utilize their skills to help.

We are proud of our employees who are so motivated to continue important training and sharpening their rescue skills, regardless of the weather conditions!

Look Before You Lock

As the temperatures heat up this summer, it is imperative to take extra precautions around car safety. Even with the windows cracked, the temperature inside a vehicle can rise to a dangerous degree, and quickly! Before leaving your vehicle, make it a habit to check the back seat for pets and children in car seats, and never rely on cracking a window to provide proper air ventilation or temperature control. Many car manufacturers now offer a Rear Occupant Alert that can detect movement in the backseat after the car is parked and locked, and will activate the car alarm to warn you that a child or pet has been left behind so check your vehicle's settings to enable this reminder. Additional reminder solutions include child car seat alerts and child monitors that sense when the rear door has been shut and movement is detected in the back seat.

If you do find yourself in a situation where you have accidentally locked a child or pet inside a car with the windows up - save a life, don't think twice - just break the window! Do not hesitate to call 9-1-1 if you see a child or pet unattended in a vehicle with the windows up.
