PARK AMBASSADORS – Help document maintenance needs, report acts of vandalism, interact with park users, promote park safety, and encourage an overall positive use of our public parks.




Rules for door-to-door salespeople in Fairfield

In Fairfield, door-to-door salespeople must have a valid 'peddler's permit' – also known as a solicitor's permit – to legally go door-to-door offering to sell goods or services. Solicitors are required at all times to display this permit which contains their photograph and their name. Solicitors may only conduct business from 9 AM to 7 PM Monday through Saturday; no solicitations are allowed on Sunday.

If a solicitor shows up at your home, you should first ask to see their peddler's permit and identification before engaging. If they cannot produce the permit, you should end the conversation. If a solicitor does have a valid permit but you don't wish to speak to him or her – simply say "no thanks – not interested" and end the conversation.

Note: You are never required to listen to any offers or contracts presented to you at your home, and the City of Fairfield does not endorse companies that go door to door. Also, be cautious about showing a solicitor any bills, such as utility bills or phone bills, or other documentation specific to your home.

Wawa ribbon cutting at new Tylersville Road location



WAWA LANDS IN FAIRFIELD

Wawa officially opened the doors of its first Fairfield location in late June, marking the company's second store in Ohio. The grand opening, at 3501 Tylersville Road, featured perks like free coffee and branded T shirts for early customers. A "Hoagies for Heroes" sandwich making face-off between City of Fairfield Fire and Police Departments also took place. Wawa plans to open an additional eight to ten stores statewide by year's end, with an ambitious plan to reach 60 Ohio stores in the next five to eight years. Additional Fairfield locations are in the works along Route 4 at Symmes Road and Mack Road.

Fairfield Gets Checked

LetsGetChecked, a global leader in at-home healthcare diagnostics, is opening a new laboratory and fulfillment facility at Fairfield Trade Center. The operation is expected to create 74 new full-time jobs and generate \$4.6 million in annual payroll, supporting the company's growing U.S. operations. The Fairfield location will serve as a Midwest hub for test kit production, logistics, and lab services, enhancing access to convenient healthcare solutions across the region.

Meyer Tool Expands to Fairfield



Meyer Tool, a precision manufacturing company supporting the aerospace and power generation industries, is relocating its Maintenance, Repair, & Overhaul (MRO) division from Cincinnati's Camp Washington neighborhood to a 70,000 sq. ft. leased facility at 575 Quality Boulevard in Fairfield. This move doubles the MRO division's floor space and positions it closer to key clients, leveraging Fairfield's location within the aerospace corridor. The transition is set to begin this fall, with full operations anticipated by the end of the year. This expansion involves a \$6.25 million investment, including approximately \$1 million for building improvements and \$5 million for new machinery. Initially, 35 employees will transfer from Cincinnati, and Meyer anticipates adding at least 15 more skilled jobs over the next three years.

Vebcom Expands Facilities and Services

Vebcom Healthcare Services, a provider of home care and adult day support for seniors and individuals with developmental disabilities, has moved from its Nilles Road site into a spacious new 7,000 sq. ft. facility at 7161 Dixie Highway. This expansion creates room for its adult day program, with separate spaces dedicated to senior programming and developmental support. The upgraded center features sensory and conference rooms, nursing stations, a kitchen, laundry, and dedicated staff areas for its now 30 member team. Vebcom continues to offer client offering transportation, health and wellness initiatives, educational workshops, and tailored care plans.

CLEANING YOUR VINYL SIDING

Vinyl siding is a common and practical choice for Fairfield homes, known for its durability and affordability. Keeping it clean is key to preserving its appeal, as neglect can lead to unsightly discoloration or staining.

That greenish tint you see on siding usually points to one of two culprits: algae or mold. Algae and mold are not the same organisms and have different requirements for cleanup.

Algae is primarily a cosmetic nuisance. It thrives in shaded areas, often on the north side of a house, feeding on accumulated dirt or tree sap. The good news? Algae is easy to remove with a simple scrub and mild soap or a pressure washer. Just remember to call in a professional for multi-story homes or tricky spots.

Mold, on the other hand, is a more serious concern that often warrants professional attention for safety. On house exteriors, it's typically a sign of water problems, like faulty gutters or drainpipes.

The good news for Fairfield residents is that most siding discoloration is simply algae. By regularly cleaning your siding, you'll not only enhance your home's appearance but also contribute to maintaining property values in your community.

The Fairfield Police Department invites residents and businesses to partner with us in protecting our city through the new CommunityWatch Fairfield camera registry program. If you own a security or doorbell camera — at your home, office, or storefront — you can play a vital role in helping solve crimes and keep our neighborhoods safe.

What is CommunityWatch?

It's a voluntary initiative that allows community members and businesses to register the location of their security or doorbell camera(s) with the Fairfield Police Department, essentially creating a public safety network across the city. This strengthens our neighborhoods by deterring crime, encouraging cooperation and coordination between the community and law enforcement, and supporting criminal apprehension.

2024 Tylersville and Seward Roundabout Project

Project Description

This project was designed to improve the capacity and safety of the existing intersection. The existing traffic signal was removed, and a modern roundabout was constructed. Roundabouts improve safety by eliminating left turns and reducing accidents and more significantly, reducing injury accidents often caused by left-turning vehicles. Overall delay is reduced at the intersection with the roundabout improvements.

Funding for the project was a collaborative effort with a grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation through the Butler County Transportation Improvement District, City of Fairfield Street and Utility funding, Fairfield Township funds, and money from the private developer within the Seward Road Joint Economic District. This project was administered by the Public Works Department.

Mission: Lifeline EMS® recognition is the American Heart Association's program that recognizes prehospital emergency agencies for their quality of care for heart attack and stroke patients. The recognition program focuses on transforming the quality of medical care by connecting all heart attack and stroke-care components into a seamlessly integrated care system. The program also helps reduce barriers to prompt treatment — starting from when 911 is called, to EMS transport and continuing through hospital treatment and discharge.

The Fairfield Fire Department is honored to have received the Gold Achievement Award again this year - acknowledging our dedication to providing a high standard of medical care and emergency service to our community.

Well done to our highly-skilled and qualified EMS crews!

October 5th - 11th is Fire Prevention Week

“Charge into fire safety” by enhancing your knowledge and awareness about lithium-ion batteries being used in your home. Most electronic items in your home are powered by lithium-ion batteries, as they store a great deal of energy in a small space, however these batteries can overheat, start a fire, or explode if overcharged or are damaged. Do your part to help prevent a fire in your home by learning how to safely buy, charge, and recycle lithium-ion batteries.



When buying an item that uses a lithium-ion battery, look for a safety certification mark such as UL, ETL, or CSA. These indicators mean the item meets important safety standards.



Charge devices safely! It is important to always use the cables that came with the product to charge. When necessary, buy new chargers directly from the manufacturer or that has been approved by the manufacturer.



Recycle batteries responsibly. Do not throw lithium-ion batteries in the trash or regular recycling bins, as they could start a fire.
