Three council members who won at-large seats in the fall election took the oath of office for the start of the new year along with returning Mayor Steve Miller.

Council Members Ron D'Epifanio, Chad Oberson and Bill Woeste were sworn in by Municipal Court Judge Joyce Campbell. All three are returning members of Council, though Ron D'Epifanio has had a four-year break due to term limits after serving several years as a ward councilmember and mayor.

Mayor Miller was also sworn in by Judge Campbell with his wife Michelle by his side.

Hundreds descend upon Harbin Park for Cyclocross

Each year in late October since 2008, Harbin Park has been the site of a national cyclocross racing competition that draws hundreds of riders and visitors from several countries and states to Fairfield.

"This is one of the many large tourist events held in Butler County each year," said Mark Hecquet, Executive Director of the Butler County Convention & Visitors Bureau. "It's grown over the years to its current capacity of 600-plus riders who spend several days in our area, bringing family and friends with them."

Mark estimates, based on a standard sports event formula, that this event brings in approximately \$120,000 in direct spending and \$280,000 in overall economic impact.

The series this past October included races on a cold Sunday at Harbin Park with the course open for practice on Thursday and Friday.

Upgrades to roads, traffic signals

Repaving of Route 4 from Seward Road to the northern corporation limit with Hamilton remains on track for 2018. Bids for the 3.46 mile stretch are currently being accepted from potential contractors. Work is expected to begin this spring and should be finished by late fall.

Citywide traffic signal improvements are also scheduled this year. This project will go out for bid this spring and be completed by the end of 2018. Improvements will include software and hardware upgrades to the central traffic system and new equipment at many traffic signals including battery backup, LED lights for illuminated signage, and new detection devices.

Curbside brush collection starts in April


Mark your calendars now for the first full week in April for the start of the City's annual curbside brush collection.

PROGRAM CANCELLATION DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

At times, unforeseen circumstances can disrupt operations and force management to cancel programs. In making these determinations, Management Staff carefully considers the safety and security of the general public and department staff.

CLASSES are defined as registered or drop-in programs that are leader-directed and offered at a predetermined time.

ACTIVITIES are self-directed programs or services that do not require registration.

SCHEDULED EVENTS are defined as meetings, private rentals, theatre rentals, theatre productions and special events taking place at a facility during a predetermined time.

CANCELLATIONS: The decision to conduct CLASSES during normal hours of operation will be made by 8 am whenever possible. The department will issue cancellation announcements through its current media outlets, city website and signage at facilities.
