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Annual hydrant flushing continues on next two Thursdays

Fairfield, OH - The City of Fairfield's Water Division is planning to conduct the third and fourth phases of the annual fire hydrant flushing program on the next two Thursdays, April 26 and May 3. Water main line flushing is tentatively scheduled to start at Noon and will continue for four to six hours.

Residents may experience discolored water for a short period of time if water is used while a flushing crew is in your area. Water should become clear after allowing services to flush for a period of five to 10 minutes.

On Thursday, April 26, the area affected will be from the northern corporation boundary, south to Mack Road and Winton Road east to South Gilmore Road. Other areas which may be affected are west of Winton Road from Hicks Boulevard to Resor Road.

On Thursday, May 3, the areas affected will be from the north and south corporation boundaries east to the City limit from Gilmore Road. Other areas affected will include the Winton Hills Subdivision.

The City flushes fire hydrants annually to check the operation of them and remove sediment from water mains in an effort to maintain high water quality.
