Maynard promoted to Chief

After a recruitment and selection process that started last November, Fairfield Police Lt. Stephen B. Maynard has been chosen as the next Police Chief for the City. Chief Maynard started on February 26, succeeding Mike Dickey, who retired after 19 years.

"Steve has risen through the ranks and evolved into an outstanding leader and law enforcement professional," said Mark Wendling, City Manager. "He and I share a common vision of the future for the Department."

Chief Maynard's service began with the Department in 1999 as an officer. He was promoted to sergeant in 2008 and then lieutenant in 2015. Most recently commander of the Department's day-to-day operations, he has been overseeing patrol officers, park rangers, and animal control officers. He has also served as a detective, field training officer, firearms instructor, and member of the Hamilton-Fairfield SWAT Team. In 2014, Chief Maynard was awarded the Police Medal for leadership in a dangerous tactical situation.

A Summa Cum Laude graduate of Ashland University with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice, Chief Maynard is also a graduate of the prestigious Federal Bureau of Investigations National Academy in Quantico, Virginia and Northwestern University Center for Public Safety in Evanston, Illinois.

"Our Police leaders and officers have been focused on developing and maintaining a good relationship with the citizens of Fairfield whom we are responsible to protect and serve," said Chief Maynard. "I am dedicated to this community and very much look forward to leading the Department's continued strong service to residents."

The Public Works Department will again provide call-in brush and limb pickup services from April 2 through October.



Decrease in crime noted in 2017

Statistics submitted by the Fairfield Police Department to the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting Program show significant decreases in criminal activity in the City. In 2016-17, crime decreased 11.4 percent. The 10-year period from 2007 to 2017 shows a significant decrease of 55.3 percent. Categories of crimes included in these reports are homicide, rape, robbery, assault, burglary, and theft.

Promoted

Fire Department now deploying bulletproof vests

Ballistic vests were recently purchased from Point Blank Body Armor and are now part of daily equipment on all of the Fire Department's vehicles, according to Deputy Fire Chief Tom Wagner.

The vests are to protect firefighters and paramedics when they are called to assist in potentially violent situations, emulating the trend of many fire departments across the nation.

"We have 44 vests distributed by various sizes to each of our three fire stations," Wagner said. "Each morning, every crew member on duty is required to select the appropriate size vest and place it on their assigned vehicle, so they have access throughout their entire shift."

The vests are red and have panels on the front and back marked "Fire" to easily distinguish fire department personnel from law enforcement personnel. Vest usage is mandatory when crew members are dispatched for situations involving weapons, assaults, domestic violence and establishments that serve alcohol.

PROGRAM CANCELLATION DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY





The sport shares features of other racquet sports, the dimensions and layout of a badminton court, and a net and rules similar to tennis, with a few modifications. Pickleball was invented in the mid 1960s as a children's backyard pastime but quickly became popular among adults as a fun game for players of all levels. CITY NEWS BRIEFS

Fairfield is beautiful!

The Cincinnati Horticultural Society gave Fairfield an award for beautification efforts at its annual event in the fall. It was the Gardener Recognition Award and our partners from the Four Seasons Garden Club were the nominators.

Several pictures of Village Green landscaping and other spots around the City were featured in the presentation, which also noted:

"The quality of life in Fairfield is enhanced by the wonderful gardens planted throughout the community. Colorful annuals are added to tree, shrub and perennial areas as seasons change to ensure year-round enjoyment."

Snow removal statistics

Through January 31, City road treatment due to snow and ice storms used 2,551 tons of salt and 9,513 gallons of calcium. Last year during the same time period, a much smaller amount was used – 1,062 tons of salt and 2,448 gallons of calcium.

Financials rated excellent

For the 30th year, the City's financial reporting received an excellence rating from the Government Finance Officers Association. This rating is similar to an accreditation as it acknowledges meeting high standards for government accounting and financial reporting.

Certifications

Three members of the Public Utilities Department recently earned new operator certifications through the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). These certifications demonstrate advanced proficiencies in the operation of public water and wastewater treatment works. New certifications were issued to Craig Clements and Chris Croucher, Class 3 Wastewater Operators, and Fred Schlichter, Class 3 Water Supply Operator.

Street resurfacing coming up

Paving of some residential streets is set to start this spring. These areas include Lake Mead/ Lake Manor and Chesapeake Way with Arcade and Horning.

Spring + house projects = permits

As spring arrives, the Building Department reminds you that while the return of favorable weather means various house projects, it also means building permits & inspections!

Contrary to popular belief, building officials and inspectors are not out to make your lives difficult, nor are building permits difficult, expensive, or a waste of time. These permits exist to ensure YOUR SAFETY and ensure you are meeting code requirements.

Applying for and obtaining a residential building permit for your project is simple and easy... Applications are available for download on our website www.fairfield-city.org. Go to the City Services pull-down menu, select Development Services, then select Building & Zoning Division, then select Building Permits. On this page you will find helpful information about what type of projects require building permits, permit fees, and links to

download a permit application. Once your permit application is filled out, bring it back to the Building & Zoning Office located in the Municipal Building at 5350 Pleasant Avenue. Permit fees are due after review, when you pick up your approved permit, and required inspections are included in the fee.

Examples of projects requiring a permit:

- Fences
- Renovations/alterations to your house
- Re-roofing
- Finishing basements
- Additions
- Sheds
- Decks
- Retaining walls
- Porches
- Antennas/towers
- Pools
- Children's play equipment (swing-sets, slides, etc.)
- Garages

It is always best to assume you need a building permit for any project you plan to undertake, unless the Building & Zoning staff informs you otherwise. The City has a knowledgeable, experienced, and friendly staff available and eager to help residents. Feel free to contact staff with any questions or stop in at the Municipal Building and ask to speak with an inspector or the building official.

NOTE: Please make sure to remind your contractors to obtain a permit from the City for any work done on your house, because you as the homeowner are ultimately responsible for having the permit.
