ALDI Coming to Fairfield

ALDI is planning to construct a new 22,000 sq. ft. grocery store in Fairfield on Pleasant Avenue at Patterson Boulevard.



The upcoming Fairfield store will be located on the site formerly occupied by Marsh Supermarket. ALDI plans to offer a modern and convenient shopping experience with a focus on fresh items, including produce, dairy and bakery sections. The store's modern design will be environmentally-friendly and feature open ceilings and natural lighting.

Russ White, Director of Real Estate for ALDI, said: "Everyone deserves high quality food at affordable prices – that's why we're one of the fastest growing retailers in the U.S. We have been a proud part of the Cincinnati community for over 20 years and are always looking for opportunities to bring the ALDI difference to more of our fans. We look forward to joining the Fairfield community to bring customers a smarter, faster and easier grocery shopping option."

Construction is expected to start soon, with the store opening planned for late 2018.



New Dog Park Taking Shape

A 6.5 acre combined dog park and future trailhead for the proposed expansion of the Great Miami River Trail is scheduled to be completed by next summer. The facility is to be on River Road between Lake Circle Drive and Gray Road adjacent to Martin Marietta's quarry lake. The land was purchased with a Clean Ohio Grant from Martin Marietta several years ago.



River – Gray Roundabout The intersection of River and Gray Roads will soon be transformed into Fairfield's first modern roundabout. The project is currently being engineered with construction expected to start by Spring 2019.

Due to the anticipated improvements to Marsh Park, the addition of the future Great Miami River Trailhead / dog park, and the Great Miami River Trail crossing along River Road, traffic calming measures are needed. The roundabout will function in that capacity by reducing traffic speeds and allowing slower moving pedestrians to safely enjoy the new park facilities and the trail between them.

Construction of the roundabout is expected to cost \$675,000. The Ohio Public Works Commission has agreed to contribute \$400,000 of the total cost.

- Are dangerous for motorists and bicyclists
- Makes your property look unkempt
- Can harm property values and upset your neighbors

 bagging and disposing or by sweeping your clippings
 back into your yard where they will compost.*

Upgraded cardiac defibrillators now in all City facilities

Fire Department personnel have just finished installing 33 new Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) in all City facilities. AEDs provide enhanced safety for the visiting public and City employees, as they are easily accessible on-site to use with someone who may be experiencing cardiac arrest. These new units are compatible with the cardiac monitors/defibrillators that are carried by Fire Department personnel and on paramedic-equipped vehicles. This ensures that precious time is not wasted when paramedics arrive on a scene where a person is experiencing cardiac arrest. All of these units are inspected by Fire Department personnel monthly to ensure that they are working properly.

PROGRAM CANCELLATION DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

At times, unforeseen circumstances can disrupt operations and force management to cancel programs. In making these determinations, Management Staff carefully considers the safety and security of the general public and department staff.

CLASSES are defined as registered or drop-in programs that are leader-directed and offered at a predetermined time.

ACTIVITIES are self-directed programs or services that do not require registration.

SCHEDULED EVENTS are defined as meetings, private rentals, theatre rentals, theatre productions and special events taking place at a facility during a predetermined time.

CANCELLATIONS: The decision to conduct CLASSES during normal hours of operation will be made by 8 am whenever possible. The department will issue cancellation announcements through its current media outlets, city website and signage at facilities. 

Standex Groundbreaking Ceremony

On May 1, City and Fairfield Chamber Board officials joined Standex Electronics to celebrate the groundbreaking of the company's new 60,000 sq. ft. engineering and manufacturing facility at 4150 Thunderbird Lane.

John Meeks, President of Standex Electronics, said in his speech that "the City worked close with us and it was really a location that we felt like will work well for the bulk of our employees. We are excited about being here in Fairfield and the support we received to get this project done is appreciated, and we look forward to working with (the City and Chamber) long-term."



Standex Electronics started in the 1960s as an acquisition for Standex International, occupying a 1950s building in Cincinnati. In 2000, annual sales were \$20 million; 2017 yielded \$195 million in sales. John added "the opportunity for us to double this business is not out of the question in the next 5-10 years."

Standex Electronics currently employs 142 in Cincinnati, including positions in production, sales, finance, engineering, marketing, and human resources. Most of those employees are expected to move to Fairfield, upon completion of construction which is anticipated in May 2019.



When Heavy Rains Come...

Due to many areas of Fairfield being identified as flood-prone, the Federal Emergency Management Administration (FEMA) has asked that residents be informed about flood issues.



FEMA

FLOODING

Low lying areas of Fairfield are subject to periodic flooding caused by overflow of the Great Miami River, usually from mid-winter to mid-spring.

The waters from the Great Miami River cause backwater flooding on Pleasant Run Creek for a distance of approximately 1/2 mile. It is in this reach and in the area along the east bank of the river that the greatest flooding occurs.

The headwater flows from Pleasant Run also flood this area, but not to the extent and severity of the Great Miami River. Shallow flooding situations occur where water overtops the banks of Pleasant Run.

FLOOD HAZARD AREAS

Two types of flood hazard areas have been designated in Fairfield: the *floodway* & the *flood fringe*.

To determine if you live in or own property in a flood hazard district, contact Fairfield's Planning Division at 513-867-5345 or use the interactive maps on our website (www.fairfield-city.org) and search for your address.

FLOOD WARNINGS

When the area receives heavy rainfall, flood warnings are issued by the radio and TV stations in Cincinnati.

FLOOD SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Take action to decrease the potential of injury due to flooding:

- Do not attempt to cross a flowing stream where the water is above your knees.
- Keep children away from flood waters, ditches, culverts and storm drains.
- If your vehicle stalls in high water, abandon it immediately and seek higher ground.
- Evacuate the flood hazard area in times of impending flood.
- Cut off all electrical circuits at the fuse panel or disconnect switches. If this is not possible, turn off or disconnect all electric appliances. Shut off the water services and gas valves in your home.

As Stormwater Flows... You May Be Unknowingly Polluting

Stormwater flowing over driveways, lawns and sidewalks picks up debris and other pollutants. This can flow directly into natural water bodies, and could make its way into underground drinking water. By practicing these household habits, you can help protect your local streams, rivers, lakes and wetlands:

VEHICLE AND GARAGE

- Use a commercial car wash.
- Check vehicles and lawn equipment for leaks and spills, and make repairs quickly. Clean up spilled fluids with absorbent material such as kitty litter or sand.
- Recycle used oil and other vehicle fluids at participating gas stations.

LAWN AND GARDEN

- Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. Use only the recommended amounts. Avoid application if the forecast calls for rain.
- Use only native plants and grasses that are drought and pest resistant. They require less water, fertilizer and pesticides.
- Sweep up yard debris rather than hosing areas down. Compost or recycle yard waste.
- Don't over-water your lawn. Water during the cool times of the day and don't let water runoff into the storm drain.
- Cover dirt piles and mulch being used in landscaping projects to prevent them blowing or washing off in your yard. Vegetate bare spots in your yard to prevent soil erosion.

HOME REPAIR AND IMPROVEMENT

- Before beginning an outdoor project, locate the nearest storm drains and protect them from debris and other materials.
- Sweep up and properly dispose of construction debris such as concrete and mortar.
- Use hazardous substances like paints, solvents and cleaners in the smallest amounts possible and follow the directions on the label. Clean up spills immediately and dispose of the waste safely. Store substances properly to avoid leaks and spills.
- Purchase and use non-toxic, biodegradable, recycled and recyclable products.
- Clean paint brushes in a sink, not outdoors. Filter and reuse paint thinner when using oil-based paints. Properly dispose of excess paints through a household hazardous waste collection program, or donate unused paint to local organizations.
- Reduce the amount of paved area and increase the amount of vegetated area.

PET CARE

- Pick up pet waste and flush it in the toilet or bag it and throw it in the trash. Leaving this on the ground increases public health risks as it contains harmful bacteria.

SWIMMING POOL AND SPA

- Drain your swimming pool only when a test kit does not detect chlorine levels. Whenever possible, drain it into the sanitary sewer system. Properly store pool and spa chemicals to prevent leaks and spills, preferably in a covered area.
