Fairfield is embarking on an exciting year-long journey to update its Comprehensive Plan! This will be a collaborative process involving all members of the community, including residents, business owners, City officials and other key stakeholders who want to see Fairfield move in the right direction. The City conducted a vigorous selection process in the spring to select a consultant – Jacobs – to help guide the update process.

What is a Comprehensive Plan?

A Comprehensive Plan provides a framework to help guide the future development and redevelopment of the community. It addresses issues of land use, transportation, economic development, housing, and other issues that affect the quality of life.

The existing Fairfield Comprehensive Plan, adopted almost 10 years ago, is due to be updated to reflect current trends and priorities while focusing on the future. It is critical that the Plan be built on the values, needs and aspirations of the community.



How Can You Get involved?



Roc's Grill & Bar Now Open in Village Green

Roc's Grill & Bar opened in late June at 500 Wessel Drive in Village Green where Symmes Tavern and Butt Shack BBQ & Grill previously operated.

The team running Roc's Grill & Bar is experienced in the restaurant business and has a plan to attract a wide range of patrons. The restaurant is set up with three separate areas catering to different groups: a high-top bar area with televisions, a sit-down section for families, and a back bar meant for ages 21 and over.

General Manager Rick Eggleton, Fairfield High School Class of 1978, says: "This is Roc's; it's different than what's been here in the past." Roc's contains a full service menu featuring five entrees (including steaks), five salads, and five sandwiches as well as traditional bar food and a separate lunch menu. There is also an emphasis on tasty seafood options including salmon dishes, crab cakes, shrimp, etc.

Rick hopes Roc's will "fill a void in Fairfield so residents don't have to leave town to enjoy a nice sit-down restaurant experience."

Roc's is dedicated to the life and memory of longtime community man Robert "Roc" Harold Roesch, the late father of owner Larry Roesch.

Hours are 11a.m. to Midnight, Tuesday through Sunday (*full kitchen shuts down at 9 p.m., late night menu featuring appetizers available until close.*)

AA Plumbing moving to Route 4

AA Plumbing is relocating its headquarters from 3259 Homeward Way to 6701 Dixie Highway. It has renovated a 10,000 square foot facility at 6701 Dixie Highway, taking a dilapidated former restaurant building and turning it into an attractive headquarters facility.

Owner Rafael Salem, a Fairfield High School graduate, explained that AA Plumbing is "growing significantly and we've outgrown our existing space." The new facility will feature a showroom and will offer plumbing supplies and a plumbing training school.

In addition to the extra space, the facility's exposure on Route 4 was very appealing to Rafael.

"I like that 35,000 to 40,000 cars pass there every day," Salem said. Rafael expects the increased exposure to boost business. "Location, location, location!"

AA Plumbing employs 16 people, not including subcontractors, and continues to grow and look for new hires.

PROGRAM CANCELLATION DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

At times, unforeseen circumstances can disrupt operations and force management to cancel programs. In making these determinations, Management Staff carefully considers the safety and security of the general public and department staff.

CLASSES are defined as registered or drop-in programs that are leader-directed and offered at a predetermined time.

ACTIVITIES are self-directed programs or services that do not require registration.

SCHEDULED EVENTS are defined as meetings, private rentals, theatre rentals, theatre productions and special events taking place at a facility during a predetermined time.

CANCELLATIONS: The decision to conduct CLASSES during normal hours of operation will be made by 8 am whenever possible. Fairfield's Water Division recently published the City's annual Consumer Confidence Water Quality Report for 2017. It is available to read online at:

All utility customers received information about the report and how to access it on their recent water bills. Hard copies of the report are also available at the City Building, 5350 Pleasant Avenue, or at the Water Treatment Plant, 5021 Groh Lane.

The report contains important information about the source and quality of Fairfield's water. Fairfield is required to test its water regularly to ensure its safety.

In 2017, Fairfield's drinking water met all federal and state standards as established by the U.S. and Ohio Environmental Protection Agencies. At no time did testing find contaminants exceeding acceptable ranges.


Planning a bonfire? There's a permit for that!

The City of Fairfield does not permit open burning – such as the burning of grass, leaves, branches, twigs, garden materials, Christmas trees, etc., either in or outside of a container.

Fires are only permitted in approved containers such as below ground pits, freestanding fireplaces and portable devices intended to contain and control outside fires. These containers must be on private property, in the rear yard, not in an easement and at least 15 feet away from a combustible structure.

Residents are permitted to burn only seasoned firewood (wood that has sat for a full year after cutting). Burning that will be offensive or objectionable because of smoke or odor emissions when atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fires hazardous shall be prohibited.

Bonfires require a permit from the fire department and have to be at least 50 feet from a combustible structure.



Fire Department receives award

Chief Don Bennett recently accepted an Above and Beyond Award for the Fairfield Fire Department from The Ohio Committee for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (ESGR).

The award was for the Department's outstanding support of its National Guard and Military Reserve employees, and was given at Ohio ESGR's annual banquet in Columbus.

Kaitlyn Uhrig, a part-time Firefighter/EMT with the City who was deployed in 2016 to Kosovo with the Ohio Army National Guard, nominated the Department for the award.

Previously, Kaitlyn had nominated Chief Bennett individually for a Patriot Award from the Ohio Committee for ESGR, which he received in a surprise ceremony at the Fire Department in late 2016. Kaitlyn called in from Kosovo to be part of that surprise ceremony.

ESGR is a program that is overseen by the U.S. Department of Defense to develop and promote supportive work environments for Service Members, and recognize supportive employers.

The paving project on John Gray Road recently wrapped up. Fairfield partnered with Hamilton County to resurface the roadway between Winton Road and Pleasant Avenue. This was an extension of the joint project between the City and Hamilton County to replace the John Gray Road bridge two years ago.


Route 4 to Bypass 4 Turn Lane Safety Improvement

As part of the ongoing maintenance work on Route 4 between Seward Road and the northern corporation limit with the City of Hamilton, changes have been made to the way drivers turn from northbound Route 4 to northbound Bypass 4.

Previously, drivers were able to make that turn using a slip lane that allowed vehicles to maintain higher rates of speed without stopping. Since the Bypass was widened in 2011, this ability to turn at higher speeds has resulted in an increase in accidents.

City staff had been exploring different countermeasures to reduce the number and severity of accidents when the Ohio Department of Transportation stepped in and offered funding for the safety improvements.

To reduce speed, the slip lane has been replaced with a standard turn lane which is governed by the traffic signal. It will take drivers more time to make a turn that previously took a very short moment to complete, but the changes are expected to result in a vast improvement in safety.
