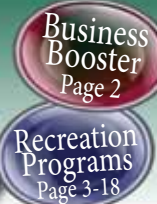

Three new members join Fairfield's Leadership Team

The City's senior leadership team welcomed three new members in September. Two of the new members were external hires, while one was an internal promotion. These positions had been open for a few months due to retirements and resignations.



DAN WENDT

Assistant City Manager, comes from the City of Norwalk, Ohio, where he was the Director of Public Safety and Service.

In that role, Wendt developed expertise in

public safety, human resources, labor relations, tracking performance, and budgeting.

As Fairfield's chief operating officer, he will touch all City operations with direct oversight of the City's human resources, information technology, safety, and communications efforts.

Prior to becoming a professional public manager, Wendt served a three-year stint in the Peace Corps in the Dominican Republic as a Community Development Administrator. He also worked as a project manager for a corporate information technology consulting firm.

Wendt holds a Master of Public Administration degree from Bowling Green State University and a Bachelor of Behavior Science degree from The Ohio State University.



TIPHANIE HOWARD

is the City's **Parks and Recreation Director**. Her responsibilities include direction of the department's recreation, arts, events, programs, and management of 37 parks and facilities covering 800 acres.

Prior to coming to Fairfield, Howard was a member of the Blue Ash, Ohio, Parks and Recreation Department for 17 years. Most recently, she headed up the Recreation Operations Division, managing golf course, recreation/aquatic center and event center operations.

Her experience also includes Director of Intramural Sports and Facilities for the athletics department at Northwestern University in Evanston, Ill., and supervisor and coordinator positions within the university recreation departments at the University of Michigan and Ferris State University (Michigan).

Howard has a Master of Sports Marketing and Administration degree from Purdue University in West Lafayette, Indiana, and a Bachelor of Recreation Management and Leadership degree from Ferris State University. She currently serves as VP of Organizational Development for Ohio Parks and Recreation Association.



SCOTT TIMMER

was promoted to **Finance Director** after serving as the City's Financial Services Manager for two years.

As Finance Director, Timmer serves at the City's Chief Financial Officer directing all financial operations including

the City's budget processes (operating, capital improvement, and tax budgets), accounts payable and receivable, fixed assets, financial reports, income tax, and utility billing.

Prior to joining the City, he spent six years with the United States Government as an accountant. Over those six years, he worked for the United States Department of Defense, Department of Veterans Affairs, and Environmental Protection Agency.

Timmer holds a Bachelor of Business Administration from the University of Dayton and a Master of Business Administration from Ohio Dominican University.

He is a member of the Association of Government Accountants where he served as President of the Greater Columbus Chapter from 2015 to 2016 and currently serves as President-Elect of the Cincinnati Chapter.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of Fairfield Parks and Recreation is to enrich the quality of life for the citizens of the community, sustain the City's natural resources and environment and provide broad-based leisure activities, cultural opportunities, facilities and services for all ages.

PROGRAM CANCELLATION DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

At times, unforeseen circumstances can disrupt operations and force management to cancel programs. In making these determinations, Management Staff carefully considers the safety and security of the general public and department staff.

CLASSES are defined as registered or drop-in programs that are leader-directed and offered at a predetermined time.

ACTIVITIES are self-directed programs or services that do not require registration.

SCHEDULED EVENTS are defined as meetings, private rentals, theatre rentals, theatre productions and special events taking place at a facility during a predetermined time.

CANCELLATIONS: The decision to conduct CLASSES during normal hours of operation will be made by 8 am whenever possible. The department will issue cancellation announcements through its current media outlets, city website and signage at facilities. Information will also be available on the automated hotline at 896-8400.

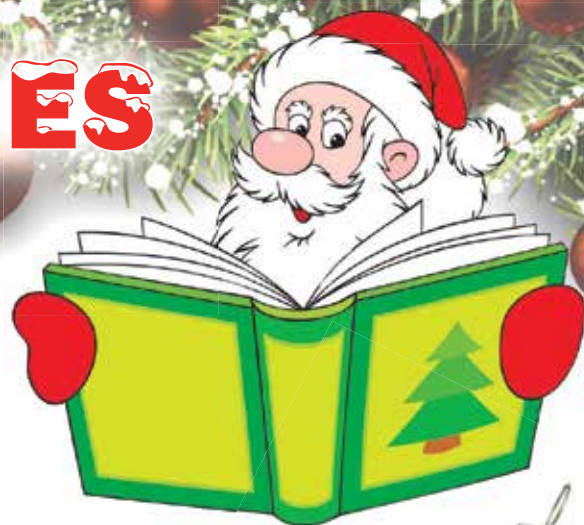

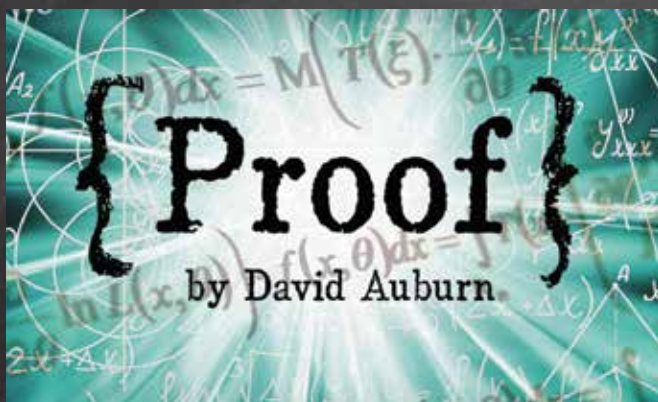

Recognizing Suicide Warning Signs

Just as training in CPR helps medically save thousands of lives each year, training in QPR (Question Persuade and Refer) teaches how to recognize the early warning signs of a suicide crisis and to question, persuade, and refer someone for help.

Four personnel from the Fairfield Fire Department went through this free training recently at Butler County Educational Resource Center. They are Firefighter/EMT/Paramedics Jon Krueckeberg, Rob Lance, Jennifer Roseberry, and Deputy Chief Randy McCreadie.

within the department and eventually other public service agencies in the area.”

It is not only the general public that could benefit from personnel in the Fairfield Fire Department being trained on this topic.

“Members of the public safety community can be emotionally impacted by many of the situations they respond to but unwilling to talk about it because they don't want to appear like they cannot handle the stress of the job,” said Deputy Chief Tom Wagner.



“The course is designed to help us recognize early warning signs of suicidal thoughts and how to approach those individuals and question them in an appropriate manner in an effort to get them help,” said McCreadie. “With this course, we became certified QPR trainers so that we can teach other personnel

Wagner said that more resources like this QRP training can also help people within the public safety community. In addition, organizations such as the International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF) and the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC) are encouraging open discussion about the issue.

Questions about your water and sewer lines?

? What is a water service line? What is a sewer service line?

- ✓ A water service line is the pressurized pipe that connects the City's public water main to a home or business. Most residential water service lines are ¾" copper.
- ✓ A sewer service line is the pipe that connects the City's public sewer main to a home or business. Most residential sewer service lines are 6" plastic or 6" clay.

? What is my responsibility as a property owner? What happens if a service line fails?

- ✓ The property owner is responsible for the service lines from within the home or business to the public right of way, which is generally one foot from the sidewalk on the property owner's side of the sidewalk.
- ✓ Water service lines fail when they leak or burst. Sewer service lines fail when they collapse or break. If a service line fails and the failure is located within the public right of way, the City will fix it. A service line failure in any other location is the responsibility of the property owner.

? Who is authorized to work on my service lines, and does the City inspect this work?

- ✓ Only contractors licensed and bonded with the City may perform repairs on service lines. All work must be inspected by a City official at the time of the repair.

? Should I enroll in a water and sewer service line warranty program?

- ✓ Participating in a service line warranty program is **completely voluntary**. The decision to enroll in such a program must be made by the property owner with consideration given to the age of the property and other unique factors. If you are considering enrolling in a warranty program, be advised to closely read all the terms and conditions and coverage restrictions.

? Does the City endorse a warranty program?

- ✓ No. The City does not endorse any service line warranty program. In the past, Fairfield endorsed a particular program, but that endorsement ended in late 2016.

FEMA New Butler County Flood Map Now Available

FEMA has completed the new Flood Map for Butler County, Ohio. The official effective date will be October 19th, 2018. This new National Flood Insurance Rate Map will replace the existing county flood hazard map of 2010.

City of Fairfield residents will benefit from more accurate flood zone boundaries, as provided by the adoption of this new Flood Map.

As always, the City of Fairfield encourages its residents to be aware of their flood risk and to purchase and maintain a flood insurance policy to protect themselves from the financial impacts of flooding. Map changes can affect flood insurance.
