Overhaul of Congested Intersection Complete

The intersection of Dixie Highway/Rt. 4 and Holden Boulevard/South Gilmore Road has consistently been in the City's three highest crash rate locations.

Many crashes at this location are a direct result of heavy congestion and typically occur at low speeds, only causing damage to vehicles. However, injuries do occur at this intersection more frequently than other locations in the City. Many of these injury crashes were caused, at least in part, by the less-than-ideal alignment between Holden and South Gilmore.

Due to these concerns, Fairfield applied for a safety grant from the Ohio Department of Transportation to make improvements. In 2011, ODOT agreed to fund 90% of the engineering, right of way, and construction. Planning began shortly thereafter and the City contracted with LJB, Inc. to perform engineering services.

The primary objective of the project was to add a southbound lane and improve the alignment along Holden and South Gilmore. This presented many challenges due to limited right of way and businesses that are built close to the street.

The design team had several meetings with the affected businesses to assess design alternatives and reach a satisfactory compromise. The final alignment required the purchase of some right of way but managed to balance the effects on businesses while improving the curve and adding the southbound lane.



In addition to the new through lane and improved alignment, improvements included new curb, storm sewer upgrades with filtering contaminants from stormwater, a six-foot-wide sidewalk, mast arm traffic signal supports, video and radar traffic detection, Dark Sky certified LED intersection lighting, internally illuminated lane-use signs in advance of the intersection, new pavement, and fresh pavement markings.

Construction began in the spring of 2016 and was completed several weeks early. The project was also ten percent under budget for a total cost of \$1,843,551.79.

This was the first transportation project in Ohio to register for certification with Greenroads, a third-party rating system that challenges transportation design and construction to go above and beyond minimum environmental, social, and economic practices. Certification is ongoing, and expected to be complete this summer.

2017 Planned Road Improvements

- Symmes Road from Rt. 4 to North Gilmore will be widened and repaved with a small stretch of culvert repair and extension.
- Seward Road will be widened from Tylersville to the railroad tracks just north of the Miami-Erie Canal Bike Path; shoulders will be added.
- Vinnedge, Walter, Anthony Wayne and Fairfield Avenues just south of Symmes and west of Rt. 4 will have deteriorating concrete replaced, including new curbs and driveways.
- South Gilmore from Mack to Rt. 4 will be repaved possibly along with other residential streets.
- Seward Road south of Tylersville to Union Center will have its culvert replaced in case road widening is necessary in the future.
- Compass Elementary across from Fairfield High School will get a new traffic signal.
- Two miles of water main pipes are scheduled to be replaced along Rt. 4 in the stretch that includes Jungle Jim's.

Officer Sam Larsh and Scout: Our 3rd Canine Unit

In November the Police Department's third K9 Officer, Sam Larsh, started duty with Scout, an 85-pound German Shepherd from the Czech Republic who is nearly two years old. Since joining the Police Department, Scout has assisted in many successful tracking situations involving drugs and a missing child.

Sam became an officer with Fairfield in 2013 after nine years as a paratrooper in the military, where he served in Afghanistan. He was a second shift patrol officer until he and Scout completed the six-week Canine Officer Training School at Shallow Creek Kennels in Sharpsville, PA this past fall. They join veteran K9 Officers John Cresap and Canaan and John Vinskey and Koda.

The Larsh family has many ties to K9 police work and the Fairfield Police Department. Sam grew up with his dad Jeff's work as a K9 Officer for 14 of the 30-plus years that Jeff was with



Jeff and Bear became a well-known team. In the 90s, they caught a rapist who victimized residents in Fairfield, Springfield Township, and Forest Park.

In 1991, *The Cincinnati Enquirer* published an article about them featuring a picture of Bear with then five-year-old Sam and his two-year-old brother Matt.

Jeff became a part-time Park Ranger in 2016 with Fairfield after retiring from Forest Park.

Work as a canine officer is a large commitment for the officer and his or her family. The K9's typically live with the officer as Scout does with Sam and his family.

John Gray Bridge Completed

A joint project with the Hamilton County Engineer's Office included replacement of the existing bridge superstructure on John Gray Road near Fairfield Greens South Trace Golf Course. It was completed in the fall. It is to be followed this year by the improvement of approximately 3,700 feet of roadway through pavement repair and resurfacing between Winton/Mill and Pleasant/Hamilton Avenues.

Marsh Park's Expansion Continues

A three-acre parcel of land at the corner of John Gray and River Roads was recently purchased as part of Marsh Park's continuing expansion from pay lake to regional outdoor recreation destination. This property was purchased with a Clean Ohio grant.

KD's Story: Success One Day at a Time

Often we try to classify success by length of time or long-term outcomes. However, success is actually the accumulation of small steps that lead us to bigger goals and dreams. The following is a story that we could say is written day by day and is a series of small steps and successes, which is what recovery really is.

When KD first began Medicated Assisted Treatment, she was an active heroin user. She was so deep into addiction that she could not sustain the eight hours required to start the medication at her induction appointment. She was also not honest with the medical team about the last time she used during the induction process. This sad error caused her to go into precipitated withdraw.

Our staff stayed beside her for several hours to help her through the extreme sickness and continued to ensure her that each day would get a little better. I'm sure that KD doubted us and wondered if she had made a grave error trying to get clean. But at this point in her life KD wanted something better. She was unemployed, had lost custody of her children, and feared for her life. Her family offered to help her one more time.

Today, thanks to those little steps, little wins and little successes, KD is in a much better place. She is currently employed, successfully following her treatment plan, and successfully participating in counseling. Even the little things now bring KD joy. The other day she said "how different it is to provide a urine drug screen now happily knowing with complete confidence that it will be clean".

Yes, there is still work to be done. But each day that KD goes without using is a step away from addiction and a step further into recovery.

Realtor of the Year Award



Union Centre Logistics Park Under Construction

Construction recently started on a new industrial/logistics park in Fairfield named Union Centre Logistics Park. This new project represents a \$30 million investment by NorthPoint Development near the intersection of Union Centre Boulevard and Seward Road. It includes the construction of two new, modern logistics buildings on a 40-acre land site.

This will be the first project in the greater Cincinnati region for Kansas City based NorthPoint Development. "The greater Cincinnati industrial market offers a unique opportunity for NorthPoint Development due to its strategic location, logistics advantages and availability of quality workforce," said Brent Miles, NorthPoint's Vice President of Economic Development.



"We expect the park will ultimately be home to more than 400 employees and see a capital investment of over \$30 million. We specifically chose this site due to many factors, including the 'open for business' nature that the City of Fairfield exhibited."

Building 1 will contain more than 477,000 square feet of leasable space, while Building 2 will have more than 128,000 square feet. Construction is expected to be complete by Fall of 2017. No tenants have been announced yet. ☀

Planet Fitness Relocating

Planet Fitness, currently located in Fairfield on Patterson Drive, plans to relocate later this year to a new facility near Jungle Jim's International Market. The new site is located on Michael Lane, just off of Route 4 behind the GE Credit Union. The site previously held three small houses that were cleared in December.

Planet Fitness will construct a new and attractive 2-story, 31,000 square foot building similar to recently-built facilities in Western Hills and Florence. Construction is expected to be finished by this Fall.

"We are making the move to Route 4 for a host of reasons," said Mike Hamilton, Chief Operating Officer of PFMW. "We'll be able to more than double the size of our club and gain visibility in

the busy Route 4 corridor. Plus, what better neighbor could we possibly have than Jungle Jim's?"



The new gym will contain 132 pieces of cardio equipment, three lines of strength equipment, tanning beds, and massage areas. It will be open and staffed 24/7. There are more than 1,300 Planet Fitness locations across the country. This location will be one of twelve in the Cincinnati region.

Additional redevelopment on Patterson Drive is expected once Planet Fitness moves out.

New Retail Center Coming To Route 4

Plans were recently approved for a new 9,000 square foot multi-tenant retail center on Route 4. The new center will be built on a vacant 1.2 acre site in the Stockton Station P.U.D., between the Spinning Fork restaurant and the new Starbucks.

The building will accommodate three to five tenants, including restaurants, retailers, or service businesses, depending on the size of the space needed by each tenant. The first two announced tenants include Rapid Fired Pizza and Guthrie's Chicken Fingers. A landscape buffer is planned for the rear of the project, closest to neighboring homes.

Cincinnati United Contractors (CUC) is the owner and developer of the center. "We are excited about this project. The site has great visibility on Route 4 and is in a vibrant part of Fairfield, said Chance Truemper, Vice President of CUC. "The City of Fairfield has always been great to work with and we are very confident that the space will fill up quickly and be a tremendous success." ☺







CALL US WHEN YARD DEBRIS IS READY FOR PICK UP

We are pleased to announce that beginning Monday, April 3, the Public Works Department will again provide a Call-in Brush and Limb Pickup Program on an alternating week schedule (see below). Residents wishing to have brush and limbs picked up can arrange to do so by calling or emailing the Public Works Department at 867-4200 at least one week in advance of the scheduled pickup areas. Normal business hours for the Public Works Department are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The three pickup areas will be the same as those used for the City's leaf pickup program. Pickups will be scheduled starting the first Monday of each month as follows:

- The first week of each month – areas west of Pleasant Avenue (U.S. 127)
- The second week of each month – areas between Pleasant Avenue and Winton Road
- The third week of each month – areas east of Winton Road

No pickups will be scheduled the last week of each month to allow for machinery repair and scheduling for the following month.

The following requirements have been established to ensure the safety and efficiency of this program. There will be no deviation from these requirements:

- Limbs must be at least six feet in length and no more than six inches in diameter and should be placed in the same direction. Any limbs larger than six inches diameter will not be picked up. (Leave limbs as long as possible.)
- Smaller branches will be considered brush and must be tied and bundled with natural fiber cord that is biodegradable (cotton, linen or twine). Bundles tied with wire, plastic or nylon cord will not be picked up. All materials will be run through a chipper, so please ensure that there are no foreign objects (metal, building materials, rocks, etc.) as they could damage equipment or cause injury to equipment operators.
- Each bundle must not be heavier than 60 pounds and must be placed between the curb and sidewalk or at the edge of the roadway, not in the curb line or on the pavement. Placement of debris in the street is a traffic and safety hazard and is a violation of City Ordinance and will not be picked up by City personnel. Do not park in front of piles. Piles that are obstructed by vehicles or equipment will not be picked up.

- To schedule a pickup be sure to call or email (public_works@fairfield-city.org) at least one week prior to the scheduled pick-up week. Calls and emails will be accepted up to 5 p.m. the preceding Monday. All calls and emails must report name, address and a telephone number. It may be necessary to limit the number of scheduled pickups in a specific week, so contact us as far in advance as possible. The program is limited to one pickup per household during each area pickup week.



- **Operation Dump Truck** can be used for larger limbs in addition to brush. This program provides residents a dumpster box or dump truck to be loaded by the property owner and disposed of by the City. For more information, please call 867-4200.
- Place small bundled quantities with your regular trash to be picked up by Rumpke at no charge.
- Brush and limbs up to four inches in diameter can be dropped off on the second Saturday of each month all year at 4935 Groh Lane. Parks crews will be on hand from 8 a.m. until Noon on these Saturdays to mulch the debris without charge. No leaves or grass clippings are accepted. Users of this service must present proof of Fairfield residence.

Help Protect Your Water Supply

Backflow is the undesired reversal of water flow, most often caused by pressure changes inside your home or in the pipes which deliver water to your home. If backflow occurs, contaminants could be pulled into your home's plumbing and public water mains, jeopardizing the quality of your water and others' water. Here are some tips to help prevent backflow at your home:

- If you operate an irrigation sprinkler system, be sure the system is equipped with an approved backflow preventer device. Have the device tested annually by a certified plumber. Properly winterize your sprinkler system each fall and have all lines blown out to prevent freezing.
- Don't submerge garden hoses in any liquid. When filling a swimming pool or even a 5-gallon bucket with a garden hose, maintain an "air gap" between the hose and the pool or bucket.
- Be mindful of what you connect to your garden hose. If you connect your garden hose to such things as hand-held fertilizer or weed-killer applicators, you risk those substances being sucked back into the hose (and possibly

into your home or public water mains).

- To protect against back-siphonage, make sure all of your hose bibbs have vacuum breakers. Your hose bibb may already have an integral vacuum breaker (the breaker often looks like a small "mushroom" cap on the top of the bibb; look for ASSE 1019A written on it). If not, a hose connection vacuum breaker can be purchased separately (look for ASSE 1011 or ASSE 1052) and screwed directly onto the outlet threads of the bibb. Vacuum breakers are inexpensive and available at home improvement stores. If you have an older toilet, ensure it has an anti-siphon fill valve/ballcock (ASSE 1002).
- Change point-of-use and whole-house water filters regularly. If you use a water filtration device in your home, be sure to replace the filter regularly. If not regularly replaced, filters can grow bacteria over time and release undesirable materials into your drinking water.

Paving on Rt. 4 Scheduled for 2018

The City of Fairfield has almost six miles of State Route 4 (Dixie Highway) within its corporate boundaries. Over 3.5 miles will be improved with a paving project in 2018. The project will resurface Seward Road to the northerly corporate boundary just north of the CSX railroad overpass. This section is also part of the historic Dixie Highway.

The upcoming project to pave Route 4 will be bid by the City in late 2017 with work expected to begin in late spring/early summer of 2018. Much of the paving will be at night due to high traffic volumes during the day. The project will also include curb replacement and other tasks which will be performed during daytime hours.

State funding will contribute approximately 50% of the needed money for this project while the other half of the cost will be provided through City funds. The current construction estimate for the project is approximately \$3.8 million.


The eastern route of Dixie Highway passes through Fairfield and is 2,169 miles long traversing from the Upper Peninsula of Michigan to Miami, Florida. The combined divisions of Dixie Highway make up 3,989 miles, and pass through eight states, four state capitals, and 144 counties.

History of Dixie Highway/Rt. 4

Local community members gathered on July 10, 1917, to commemorate Dixie Highway being designated as a state route. The newly-designated State Route 4 was originally paved in brick to upgrade the dirt and gravel road.

Upgraded from a two-lane road to four lanes in 1964, various widenings and improvements have occurred since that time. These have added turn lanes and additional capacity at various locations, though much of the 1964 infrastructure remains today.

Serving as a vital component to the economy of the region, nearly 500 businesses are located along or adjacent to the Route 4 corridor in the City of Fairfield. Traffic counts from 2014 reveal that over 46,000 vehicles per day utilize the southern section of Route 4 near the Hamilton County line and 44,000 pass daily near the Bypass 4 intersection in Fairfield.



Property Maintenance

If you see a property that looks as if it has been abandoned, has tall grass and weeds, or has other blighting issues, please report it to the Building & Zoning Division. For your assistance and confidentiality, the City has created a special Property Maintenance Hotline at 513-867-5321 and email at PropertyMaintenance@fairfield-city.org. During business hours, you can talk directly with an inspector. After hours, you can leave a message which will be addressed the next day. Anonymous reports are accepted.

In most cases, the property owner will remedy the issue after being contacted by the City. If the property owner does not remedy the issue in a timely manner, the City can initiate legal action that allows it to step in and address the issue.



Common property maintenance problems:

- Overgrowth - Tall grass higher than 8 inches and/or other vegetative overgrowth
- Garbage & Debris – Dilapidated furniture, household products, construction materials, etc.
- House Maintenance – Broken windows, roof and gutter problems, peeling paint, etc.
- Inoperable or Unlicensed Vehicles – Vehicles or trailers that are inoperable or unlicensed in residential areas
- Parking – Vehicles and/or trailers must be parked on paved surfaces, not grass
- Accessory Structures – Improperly maintained garages, sheds, fences, retaining walls, swimming pools, etc.

New County Flood Maps in 2018

FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) is working on a new flood map for Butler County, Ohio. The projected effective date will be Spring 2018. This new National Flood Insurance Rate Map will replace the existing county flood map from 2010.
