Fairfield Forward: City's comprehensive plan is taking shape

Throughout the past several months, residents, property owners, business owners and City officials have been sharing ideas and opinions about how Fairfield should be developed and re-developed in the future.

This vital input has been part of the City's comprehensive plan update process called *Fairfield Forward* that is expected to be complete by summer 2019. Feedback from the public for this plan has been collected in a variety of ways, including through several public events and an online survey.

The feedback collected is being used in the current phase of *Fairfield Forward*. In this phase, the City's Planning Team is writing an initial draft of the plan document. Drafting the plan entails crafting a vision statement, goals and objectives, and implementation strategies. The final document is projected to be completed by summer with a public open house scheduled for this spring to obtain additional public feedback.

Traffic signal improvements include emergency feature

At traffic signals around Fairfield, motorists might notice a separate white light that occasionally illuminates in addition to the standard traffic signal. This is a white LED emergency vehicle preemption indicator and it provides motorists with important information.

As a siren approaches, microphones strategically located at each intersection pick up on certain frequencies and patterns in the siren sound and determine the direction from which the siren is approaching.

The white light illuminates in all directions – flashing in the direction from which the siren is detected, and solid for the remaining directions. Simultaneously, the traffic signal's program is overridden by the preemption hardware. All signals cycle to red and the direction from which the siren approaches – with the flashing white light – cycles to green.

Drivers should always remember to move to the side of the road and stop when emergency vehicles are passing. The green traffic signal, when accompanied with the flashing white preemption light, should signify to drivers that emergency vehicles are approaching from behind, not that they have a typical green light.

When a signal is preempted by an emergency vehicle, pedestrians are expected to vacate the intersection immediately. In most instances, pedestrians will hear the siren before motorists and should be taking appropriate steps to remain clear of the emergency vehicle. When a pedestrian is unable to hear a siren, it is the first responders' responsibility to avoid them.

The system is designed to resume normal operations within 10 seconds after hearing the emergency vehicles exit the intersection. If the system does not hear the vehicle exit, the preemption will hold for 25 seconds before resuming normal operations.

Every element of the City's preemption system is checked twice a year for correct operation by Fairfield's signal maintenance contractor. The City's ongoing Intelligent Traffic System Phase 2 project is adding preemption to all remaining signals that don't currently have this ability. This project will be complete in early 2019.



Traveling around Fairfield should be a little easier this year, thanks to the completion of these road projects:



► **Improvements to North Gilmore Road between Holden and Symmes included widening to three lanes between Holden and Busway, making grade improvements at the railroad tracks, and adding paved shoulder to the two-lane section between the railroad tracks and Symmes Road.**

► *At the Route 4 and Route 4 bypass intersection, a northbound right turn yield lane was straightened to align with the traffic signal.*



► *Route 4 was resurfaced from Seward Road to the northern corporation limit along with curb and base repairs, thermoplastic pavement markings, and raised pavement markers.*

TAX RETURN DEADLINE - APRIL, 15 2019

Tax Season has arrived

The City has **mandatory** filing for all residents over the age of 18 as well as all businesses that are located or doing business in Fairfield. The local tax return is due April 15, 2019. It must include all W2s, Federal 1040, any schedules, and a signature to be considered filed.

Extension to file

Taxpayers who are granted a Federal or State extension are automatically granted an extension to file their Fairfield tax return. While the Ohio Revised Code does not require the taxpayer to notify the local tax office, it is recommended to do so. Notifying the tax office of the extension prior to filing the return is encouraged for the following reasons:

1. It reduces unnecessary correspondence to residents;
2. It helps to keep the Tax Office accounts in a current status;
3. It helps the Tax Office to more effectively utilize tax revenue, which is mutually benefiting to the City and the community it serves.

If you would like to notify the tax office of your extension, please send an email to

Income.tax@fairfield-city.org

with the word extension in the subject line. Please include your full name and address. The extension should be attached to the email or submitted with your local income tax return. Please also remember that the extension does not extend the time to pay.

1099-G Statements for Refunds/Credit

Each year during tax season, the City's Division of Taxation issues 1099-G statements to individual taxpayers, notifying them that they have received a refund or credit.

State and local tax authorities must file information returns with IRS on Form 1099-G with respect to individuals' income tax refunds, or credits or offsets with respect to income taxes, aggregating \$10 or more in one calendar year. The return must include the aggregate amount of the state or local income tax refund (credit or offset).

A "creditor or offset" is a tax overpayment which, in lieu of being refunded to the taxpayer, is either applied against an existing liability of the taxpayer; is available for application against a future liability of the taxpayer; or is otherwise used or available for use for the taxpayer's benefit.

Please consult with your tax preparer concerning the taxability of this 1099-G issued to you for tax year 2018.

Paperless becoming a reality for Fire Department

Beginning early this year, the Fire Department will move closer to its goal of being paperless as two new software programs, **HealthEMS** and **Target Solutions**, go live.

"These new systems represent the Department's commitment to saving money through the reduced use of paper as well as our commitment to better use of personnel time and production of accurate data," said Deputy Fire Chief Tom Wagner.

HealthEMS, a cloud-based patient care reporting system, will allow Emergency Management Services (EMS) crews to gather and record information and necessary signatures in real-time on I-Pad tablets while in the field.

This software is connected with the computer system in Fairfield's 911 Dispatch Call Center that will automatically fill in the incident address and response times. The software is also compatible with the Fire Department's cardiac monitors for EKGs, vitals, procedures and medications so that this data can be uploaded into the report seamlessly.

Crews will be able to finish reports at the Emergency Room instead of having to fax them after they get back to the Fire station. Hospitals will be able to retrieve patient data via their own secure portal into the system.

Target Solutions will allow personnel to record fire and EMS trainings and keep track of each crew members' progress on sustaining credentials. Target Solutions will also be used to perform daily vehicle checks and inventories on everything from EMS bags to store rooms at each station. Personnel perform the check from an app.

Another area where the department has gone paperless is fire prevention. All fire inspections of businesses and occupancies in the city are completed in the field by the fire inspector on a tablet, including any signatures, using software from Emergency Reporting. The fire inspector can then e-mail the business a copy of the inspection, which saves on postage or time spent hand delivering them.

The Department has also begun updating or creating new pre-plans of area businesses. Pre-plans allow fire crews responding to a business to pull up a file on the business that shows the layout of the building, hydrant locations, fire department connection, utility shut-offs, any hazardous materials stored there and other pertinent information. Firefighters will now be able to complete the pre-plans on tablets in the fire trucks and upload the information directly to the cloud.
