Remember your neighbors who may be at greater risk and perhaps offer to pick up carry-out food for them as well. Please thoroughly wash your hands prior to and after any outside interaction. The time is now to unite as a community. Stay safe, remain informed, continue to look out for each other with compassion and love, and support our local businesses. **United we stand.***



COVID-19 Resources for Small Businesses:

The city continues to track resources for our business community, which will be shared via our website and social media. Already linked from our website is a comprehensive list of resources for businesses responding to the challenges of COVID-19 that was compiled by REDI Cincinnati, a regional economic development partner to the city.

As a result of the pandemic, Ohio businesses are eligible to apply Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program through the **Small Business Administration** (SBA). The low-interest (3.75%) loans can provide working capital to cover accounts payable, debts, payroll, and other bills that the virus has affected the ability to pay. Businesses can apply online at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/>



The **Fairfield Chamber of Commerce** is also working individually with businesses to provide assistance during this time. This includes coordination to convey business conditions and concerns on the ground with state and federal officials. Visit fairfieldchamber.com to learn more.

Businesses and non-profits with less than 500 employees are eligible to apply for the Paycheck Protection Program. This program provides a loan to maintain payroll and pay other select expenses such as rent and utilities. The SBA will forgive loans if all employees are kept on the payroll for eight weeks and the money is used for eligible purposes. Businesses can find more online through the SBA and would need to apply through existing SBA lenders, such as banks and credit unions.

Jungle Jim's Expansion Continues



There's always something new at Jungle Jim's International Market. Last year brought the construction of The Oscar Station, an event center and bourbon bar. This year will bring additional space created across the front of the market along Route 4.

Construction is now underway to add 17,000 sq. ft. onto the front of the store to create a new grand entrance. An improved space for Fifth Third Bank will be created, including both interior and exterior entrances. Two additional retail spaces will also be built, one of which will be occupied by a new Graeter's Ice Cream location. The project is expected to be completed before the end of 2020.



WestRock Opening Fairfield Facility



WestRock, a major corrugated packaging company based in Atlanta, Georgia, has signed a five year lease to occupy a 329,977 sq. ft. facility located at 375 Distribution Circle. Long-time residents may recall that this building was once used as a distribution facility for Toys"R"Us.

WestRock will use the facility as a logistics center for their operations in and around Ohio. Staffing and operation of the facility will be provided by a third-party logistics firm contracted by WestRock.

Limbs and brush can be dropped off at the site on Groh Lane just past Waterworks Park. During these months there will not be any mulched chippings available for the public.

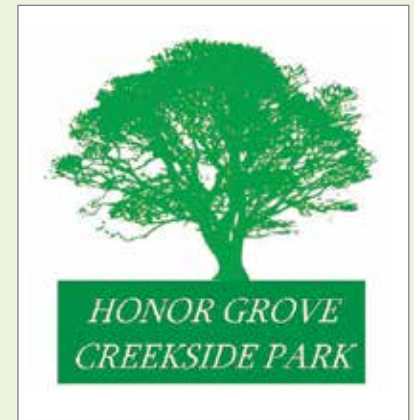

The 2020 Census is here! A mailed invitation to respond to the census should have been received by all residents between March 12 and 20.

If you have not yet responded, there are three ways to complete the census from the comfort and safety of your home:

1. Online: 2020census.gov
2. By Phone: 844-330-2020 (Español: 844-468-2020)
3. By Mail: If you do not respond to the invitation by mail or phone, you will receive a paper questionnaire in the mail to complete and return.

Responding online is secure and the easiest option! You do not need the invitation to respond.

If you are responding for your home, count everyone who lives and sleeps there most of the time as of April 1, 2020. This includes young children, foster children, roommates, and any family members or friends who are living with you, even temporarily.



An accurate count is critical because the results of the census will influence funding for transportation, public safety, schools, and other major programs for the next decade. Do your part to ensure Fairfield has a complete count!



Panera Bread to Open New Fairfield Location

Plans have been approved for the construction of a new 4,539 square foot Panera Bread location on Route 4. The new standalone store will be located in front of the Shared Harvest Foodbank opposite of Production Drive. Earthwork started in late February and construction is now underway.

The new Panera Bread will include a drive-through, outdoor seating, and other features of the

Panera 2.0 store model, which Panera introduced in 2014.

Panera franchisee Covelli Enterprises will operate the location. Based in Northeast Ohio, Covelli Enterprises is the largest franchisee of Panera Bread locations with more than 300 stores in five states and Canada.

The new Fairfield store is expected to open up later this year.



Tall Grass? Let the City Know.

Spring rains and warmer temperatures bring the start of the grass growing season. The City of Fairfield has an ordinance requiring grass to be mowed to a height of less than 8 inches.

If you see a property that has tall grass and weeds, or looks like it has been abandoned, please report it to the Building & Zoning Division. For your assistance and confidentiality, the City has created a Property Maintenance Hotline at 513-867-5321 or PropertyMaintenance@FairfieldOH.gov.

During business hours, you can talk directly with an inspector. After hours, you can leave a message which will be addressed the next day.

In most cases, the property owner will remedy the issue after being contacted by the City. If the property owner does not remedy the issue in a timely manner, the City can initiate legal action that allows it to step in and address the issue.

Home Improvement Projects = Permits Needed

With the return of nice spring weather, many people begin planning their “honey-do” projects. The Fairfield Building Department would like to remind all homeowners to check with the City before starting your project to find out what permits and inspections are required.

Contrary to popular belief, building officials and inspectors are not out to make your life difficult or waste your time and money. These permits exist TO ENSURE YOUR SAFETY.

Examples of projects requiring a permit:

- Home Renovations or Additions
- Finishing Basements
- Garages
- Re-roofing
- Decks
- Fences
- Swimming Pools
- Sheds
- Retaining Walls
- Childrens’ Play Equipment
- Driveway Expansions



It is always best to assume you need a permit for any project, unless Building Division staff informs you otherwise. The City has knowledgeable, experienced, and friendly staff available and eager to help residents. Feel free to contact the Building Division at (513) 867-5318 or BuildingandZoning@FairfieldOH.gov.

NOTE: Please make sure to remind your contractors to obtain permits for any work performed at your house. You as the homeowner are ultimately responsible for having the permit.

New City logo and tagline unveiled

After several months of study and feedback from residents, senior leaders, City Council, employees and others who know best what makes Fairfield great, a new brand for the City went live on March 10, 2020!

Since 1963, the City of Fairfield had been officially represented in graphic form by the City seal, which was created by a resident named Ted Hershner. Various departments, services and activities throughout the City have created graphic representations over the years, resulting in a wide variety of looks across the City. It was time to start marketing the City consistently with one uniform look and color scheme while honoring and maintaining the values and history that the seal represents.

Residents were surveyed to find out the attributes that make Fairfield the great place that it is in which to live, play and work. The top five themes that emerged from more than 400 surveys were: Resourceful, wholesome, open, adventurous, and optimistic.

The Field is Open - The Field is Open is a unifying term that speaks to the people, places and things that make Fairfield a delightful, fun, ideal place to live and visit. The word "open" is used for a modern take on the City's long-standing descriptor as The City of Opportunity. The entire phrase is a rallying cry, a casual reference, a call to action for people who are loyal to and love their City, much like The Big Apple is to New York City, or a favorite chanted phrase is to a sports team.

Fairfield is open to business, adventure, families, resources, diversity, generations, play, imagination - EVERYONE. Open is a state of mind from Route 4 to Village Green to Fortune 500 headquarters to Marsh Park, Furfield and the Great Miami River Aquifer.

The Beacon - The green beacon over Fair and Field speaks to the history of the City, as it evolved from the City's longstanding seal. The definition of a beacon is that it attracts attention to a specific location - a perfect description for what a City's logo and tagline is designed to do. Fairfield's beacon is evolved from the center space between the four gears in the City's seal.



The Seal - The City of Fairfield's seal was designed and adopted in 1963 to symbolize the integrated characteristics that have established Fairfield, Ohio, as the City of Opportunity. This seal and descriptive phrase that is so much a part of the City's history was used to design the logo and tagline in 2020 and will still be used for official business.
