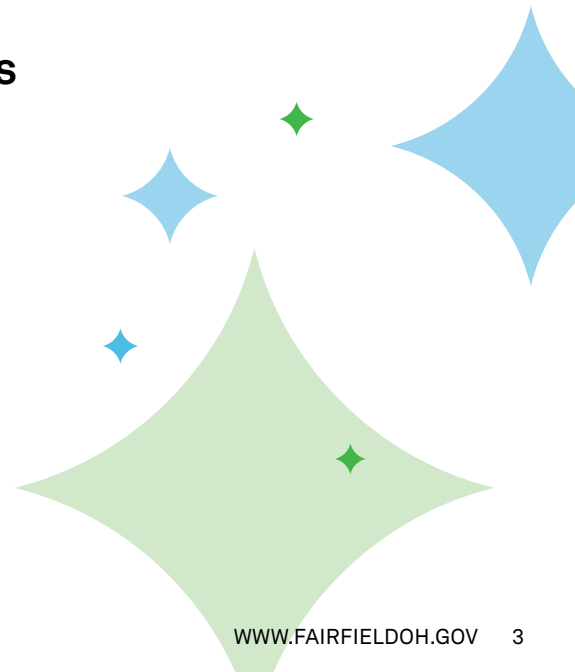

CITY OF FAIRFIELD 2024 INCOME TAX FILING INFORMATION

Who Needs to File:

- Residents between the ages of 18-65 (including part-year residents).
- Residents 65 years or older with taxable income.
- Businesses doing business in Fairfield.
- Employees working in Fairfield whose employer failed to fully withhold Fairfield taxes.
- Non-residents with income or losses from self-employment and/or rental property earned within the City limits.

When to File:

- Individuals and Business Net-Profit (excluding fiscal year filers) due **April 15, 2025**.
- Employer reconciliations due **February 28, 2025**.
- Please visit our website for details on extensions for time to file your return.

What is Needed to File:

Individuals

- Federal 1040 with any applicable schedules.
- W-2(s)
- Any additional supporting documentation.

Business Net-Profit Returns

- Completed business return.
- Federal Tax Return.
- Any supporting statements, schedules, or other documentation.

Employer Withholding Reconciliations

- Completed Fairfield Reconciliation form.
- Employee W-2(s) in electronic or paper format (see website for details).

Nth Cycle ribbon cutting ceremony

NTH CYCLE CUTS RIBBON ON FAIRFIELD FACILITY



The leadership of Nth Cycle joined local, state, and federal officials for a formal ribbon cutting to officially mark the opening of the company's

Fairfield facility. Located on Le Saint Drive, the facility is the first commercial production site in the United States to recycle and refine high-purity critical metals nickel and cobalt. Currently, these materials are primarily sourced overseas, and both the federal government and manufacturers have prioritized strategies to onshore sourcing of these precious metals.

Headquartered in Massachusetts, Nth Cycle is a globally recognized critical metal refining company. The company has developed a groundbreaking system to produce premium nickel cobalt MHP, a required component for clean-energy, electric vehicle, and defense markets. The patented system is known as *The Oyster*. In the words of Megan O'Connor, co-founder and CEO of Nth Cycle, "This system not only helps to end decades of U.S. reliance on foreign supply chains, but also sets a new standard for modular, sustainable, high-purity critical metals production".

C&T Design & Equipment Plans Expansion

A long-time Fairfield business has announced plans to expand its primary Fairfield facility. C&T Design and Equipment, a leader in food service consulting and commercial kitchen design, operates an office and warehouse building on Port Union Road and has storage and distribution space at a separate rented facility. A 14,000 square foot expansion of the Port Union facility will allow the company to consolidate operations, providing for increased efficiency and continued growth. The company plans to retain 27 employees in Fairfield after the project.

C&T provides equipment procurement and installation, engineering, and project management for major kitchen installations. The company's clients include Buffalo Wild Wings and Penn Station East Coast Subs.





Cincinnati Center for Autism Opens New Facility

The Cincinnati Center for Autism formally opened its new facility located at 100 Commercial Drive. This state-of-the-art center is designed to provide comprehensive support and resources for individuals on the autism spectrum and their families.

With an expanded space, the new location offers enhanced therapy rooms, sensory-friendly environments, and dedicated areas for social skills development. The center's mission remains focused on empowering individuals through tailored programs that promote independence and social integration.

The grand opening celebration was held in November and featured guided tours, demonstrations of innovative therapeutic approaches, and opportunities for families to connect with staff and other community members.

New Route 4 Restaurants: The Plove and Pollo Shaddai

Route 4 has two new restaurants, The Plove and Pollo Shaddai. The Plove is located at 6025 Dixie Hwy and serves a plethora of Mediterranean cuisines, from beef kabobs to freshly made hummus. Make sure to stop by or place an order online!

City of Fairfield Secures Grant Funding for EV Charging Stations

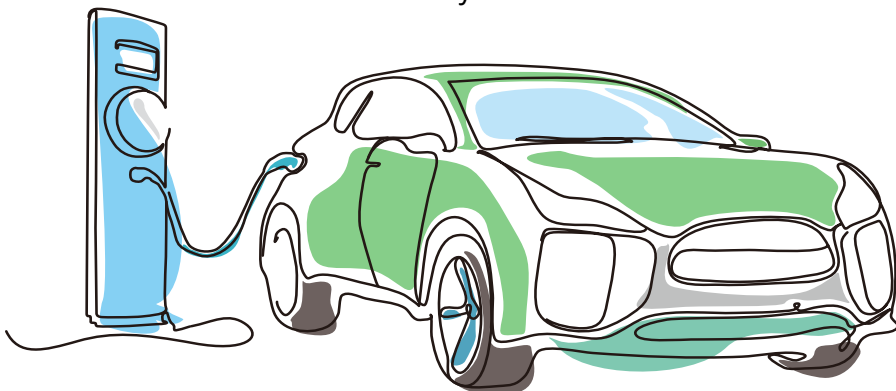
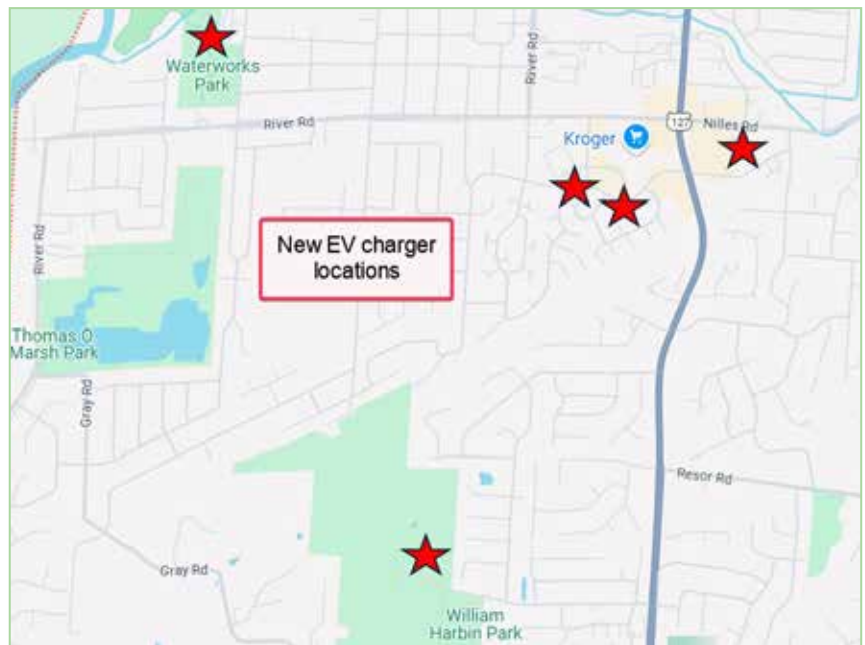
The City of Fairfield was recently awarded a grant of \$443,971 from the Ohio Kentucky Indiana Regional Council of Governments (OKI) to fund the installation of electric vehicle (EV) charging infrastructures around the City. This grant, along with a prior grant awarded to the City by OKI, will result in new EV charging stations at:

- Community Arts Center on Wessel Drive
- Harbin Park
- Justice Center on Nilles Road
- Lane Public Library on Corydale Drive
- Waterworks Park on Groh Lane

The City plans to have the stations installed in 2025. No local dollars will be spent on this project as the grants will cover the full costs of equipment, installation and labor. The City intends to charge a fee to EV drivers using these new stations – similar to fees charged at private sites (such as the new stations located in the Kroger parking lot).

The project will utilize federal Carbon Reduction Funds, with Ohio Toll Revenue Credits provided in lieu of local match. The new charging stations will not only benefit the environment by reducing emissions, but also support local businesses as EV owners can charge their vehicles while visiting nearby businesses and amenities. Three locations of the new stations will be in the Town Center, while two others will be in City parks.

This project aligns well with the City's sustainability plan, *Fairfield Sustains*, which was adopted by Council in September 2024. This plan provides a roadmap designed to ensure Fairfield maximizes its resources, addresses environmental, economic & livability considerations, and improves quality of life for all residents – now and in the future. One component of this plan is expanding EV charging infrastructure throughout the City – making it easier for residents and visitors to transition to electric vehicles if they so choose.



FAIRFIELD FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS

Community Connections



Keeping Fairfield a safe place to live, work, and visit is a whole community effort! The Fairfield Fire Department strongly believes that well-informed and prepared stakeholders will promote a safer community- which motivates our organization to get even more involved in various outreach events and activities to share fire safety information.

One of our favorite and most impactful methods of spreading the message of fire safety is the FFD Reading Program that has been established in collaboration with Fairfield City Schools.

Throughout the school year, FFD members are welcomed into first grade classrooms to read a book focused on fire safety and demonstrate how firefighters may look and sound while battling a fire by dressing in their Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). FFD members love answering student questions and share important fire safety tips with students - including encouraging them to make a Fire Escape Plan with their families at home.



The FFD Reading Program is so important to our organization- as it is a great opportunity to share critical fire safety information with young children in a low-stress and fun environment. Not only does this program help prepare students, in case they should ever come in contact with firefighters at home, but it also gives so much back to our personnel, who have a blast interacting with and sharing their passion for firefighting with young students!

2024 Fairfield Rotary Club Firefighter of the Year

Lieutenant Shiflett's expertise is also utilized as a member of the Butler County Technical Rescue and the Hamilton County Urban Search and Rescue Teams. Purple Monkey Project 2024 Firefighter of the Year

Erin Toney was named the 2024 Firefighter of the Year by the Purple Monkey Project, for her undeniable passion for serving others and educating the public about important safety information. Erin teaches CPR/AED training to community members and businesses, and consistently shares ideas to continuously improve outreach programs. She became a member of the department's Fire Investigation Team and looks to obtain her Fire Investigator certification in 2025. Erin's love for the Fairfield community and its people is what drives her to help with the department's Community Engagement programs and ensure that all are left with better knowledge and skills in the areas of fire and life safety.



Department Personnel Update

The Fairfield Fire Department remains a strong, growing full-time department that draws interest from top-notch applicants hoping for the opportunity to work hard serving a supportive community. We are excited and proud to share that FFD has grown to 66 full-time firefighters, with 4 staff chiefs, compared to only 27 full-time employees in 2017. This increase in well-trained, full-time personnel is surely a positive sign that our department has more resources to better serve the needs of Fairfield residents, visitors, and employees.



Winter Weather Preparedness

While winter weather in the Southwest Ohio area can be unpredictable- ranging from mild temperatures and gray skies to bone-chilling cold and snow- one thing that you can do is be prepared for all conditions. A great place to start in your preparedness journey is ensuring that you have an emergency preparedness kit in your vehicle in case you are ever stranded for a long period of time. Check out the list below for a basic emergency kit template, however, your kit should be tailored to the specific and unique needs of your family- whether you have members with special needs or have small children with particular food preferences or interests- please include additional items that will be helpful for your family!

Keep your home prepared for winter weather by having your fireplace inspected and cleaned annually, prior to lighting a fire for the first time. Also consider using a fireplace heat screen to keep embers inside the fireplace and pets and small children out! While having carbon monoxide detectors on each level of your home is a wise choice year-round, it is especially important if you utilize a gas fireplace in your home for extra heat. Finally, be vigilant to keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from all heat sources, including radiators, fireplaces, wood stoves, space heaters, and candles. Stay safe and warm Fairfield!

FROM THE DESK OF THE CHIEF



Looking back on 2024, it is apparent that Fairfield Fire Department experienced a strong period of positive growth. From gaining qualified employees who strive to provide great service to our community, to increased hours of training, responses made, and community outreach events attended- FFD has certainly been busy. For perspective, over the last four years, the number of calls the department responded to increased by nearly 24% — 6,211 in 2020 to 7,688 in 2023. The increased demand on department resources has only bolstered our need to transition to a completely full-time department

We are committed to upholding our high standard of service and look forward to continued professional department progression and new opportunities to engage with Fairfield stakeholders in 2025!

Hints to Help During Snow Removal

During snow removal operations, the City of Fairfield requires your assistance in helping our crews be more efficient in their duties.

1. Please move all vehicles from the street if possible to ensure our drivers may clear the snow from the roads more efficiently.
2. When using a snow blower or shoveling your driveway, do not put the snow into the street.
3. The snow has to go off to the side of the road or into the right-of-way area (that includes driveway aprons). To save yourself some work, if you can, wait until the driver has finished plowing your street. Then shovel your apron. *NOTE: our goal is to clear the street from curb to curb.*
4. Do not try to pass a snowplow or salt truck. It is recommended that you stay 100 feet back from salt trucks.
5. Every truck has blind spots, so don't assume the driver can see you. Please do not pull up behind a salt truck.
6. The City will not take requests for specific streets to be plowed. The City is sectioned into areas with the streets broken down by priority.

As we enter a new year, many people begin researching and planning home improvement projects. The Fairfield Building Division would like to remind all homeowners to check with the City before starting your project to find out what permits and inspections are required.

Contrary to popular belief, building inspectors are not out to make your life difficult or waste your time and money. These permits exist TO ENSURE YOUR SAFETY.

NOTE: Please make sure to remind your contractors to obtain permits for any work performed at your house. You, as the homeowner, are ultimately responsible for having the permit.

Special Needs Registry



Emergencies can happen at a moment's notice. Mobility, learning, developmental and other physical disabilities can create specific needs that individuals must address to be able to respond to an emergency. Many communities ask people with a special need, severe medical condition, or special circumstance to register with the local fire or police department or emergency management

office, so help can be provided quickly in an emergency. The City of Fairfield Police Department provides a similar voluntary special needs checklist. This list is a tool that enables emergency responders to prioritize their response during emergency situations. To be fully inclusive, the City of Fairfield proactively decided to collaborate with its residents to ensure the highest level of service and safety. The checklist requests information to serve the residents who are vulnerable, at risk, or with a physical, intellectual, or development disability. In emergency situations, keeping everyone safe and calm is paramount. With this list, dispatchers can alert first responders to any special needs that may be onsite. The Fairfield Police Department's voluntary registration is open to all citizens with special needs who reside, attend school, or are employed in the City of Fairfield.

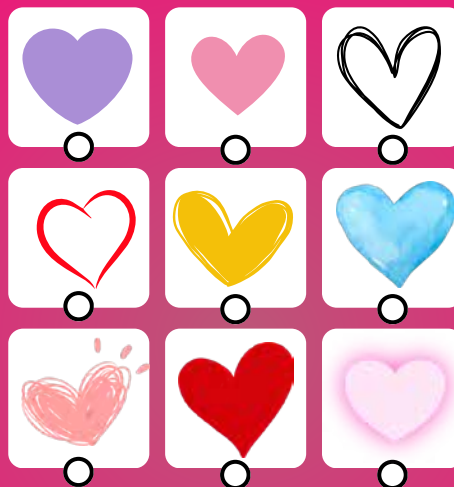

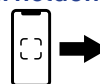


