Who Needs to File:

- Residents between the ages of 18-65 (including part-year residents).
- Residents 65 years or older with taxable income.
- Businesses operating in Fairfield.
- Employees working in Fairfield whose employer did not fully withhold Fairfield taxes.
- Non-residents with income or losses from self-employment and/or rental property earned within the City limits.

When to File:

- Individuals and Business Net-Profit (excluding fiscal year filers) due **April 15, 2026**.
- Employer reconciliations due **February 28, 2026**.



Recognized for Excellence: The Auditor of State Award with Distinction

We are pleased to announce that our Finance Department has qualified for the prestigious Auditor of State Award with Distinction! This honor signifies that we have received a “clean” audit report, reflecting our dedication to financial transparency and responsible management. Earning this award requires meeting stringent criteria that demonstrate sound fiscal practices. Key requirements include the timely submission of financial reports to the Auditor of State’s Office on the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) basis, which includes preparing an Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR). Crucially, the final audit report must be free of any significant issues, such as findings for recovery, material citations, material weaknesses, or significant deficiencies. Furthermore, our management letter contained no comments regarding ethics referrals, untimely filings, bank reconciliation issues, or other concerns, affirming that our operations are financially sound and well-managed. This award is a testament to our commitment to upholding the highest standards of financial accountability for our residents.





Stay Safe on Winter Roads

Winter weather can make driving unpredictable and hazardous. Adopting a few simple habits can go a long way toward keeping you and others safe. Whether you're commuting to work or just running a few errands around Fairfield, remember these tips before hitting the road.

1. Slow down and increase follow distance.

Icy and snowy roads greatly reduce traction. Leave extra space between vehicles and give yourself plenty of time to stop.

2. Clear your car completely.

Brush snow and ice from your roof, windows, mirrors, and lights. Not only will this improve visibility for you, it will also prevent flying snow from creating visibility issues for others.

3. Keep your gas tank at least half full.

Cold temperatures can cause fuel lines to freeze. Getting stuck without heat in frigid weather is dangerous.

4. Prepare and carry an emergency kit in your vehicle.

Include items like a blanket, flashlight, phone charger, bottled water, snacks, and a small shovel. These items can make a big difference if you become stranded.

5. Give snowplows and emergency vehicles room to work.

Keep your distance and never pass a snowplow while it's operating. Visibility can be limited, and road conditions may be worse than they appear. Make sure to give emergency vehicles plenty of space to navigate.

6. Check the forecast before you go.

If conditions look bad, consider postponing your travel. Your safety is worth waiting for.

Taking a few extra minutes to prepare can help ensure you reach your destination safely and help keep Fairfield's roads safer for everyone.

SAFETY SPOTLIGHT: Smart 911 — Help Us Help You

In an emergency, every second counts.

The Smart911 app allows Fairfield residents to create a *free, secure safety profile* that automatically shares critical details with dispatchers when they call 9-1-1.

You can include information such as:

- Medical conditions and allergies
- Household members and pets
- Your home address (even for cell phone calls)
- Door lock or security system codes
- Emergency contacts

When a 9-1-1 call comes in, dispatchers can instantly see this information, helping first responders arrive faster and better prepared.

ELECTRIC AGGREGATION PROGRAM PERFORMANCE REPORT

On November 7, 2023, the majority of voters in the City of Fairfield voted “Yes” on giving City Council the authority to start energy aggregation programs. Since then, the City has become a certified aggregator with the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO). Being a certified aggregator allows city officials to negotiate utility rates for the electric and natural gas use for residents and small businesses that use Duke Energy Ohio.

This report illustrates the community and individual savings of the Energy Aggregation program since its inception in May of 2024. Additionally, this report showcases the City’s ongoing aim to provide stable, fixed-rate plans to protect residents and small businesses from volatile energy market fluctuations.



How to help our Public Works crews during snow and ice response

During snow removal operations, the City of Fairfield needs your assistance in helping our crews be as efficient as possible in performing their duties.

- Please move all vehicles off the street if possible. Parking off the street makes it easier for snowplow drivers to clear the roadway quickly and efficiently.
- The snow must be deposited on the side of the road or within the right-of-way, and this includes covering driveway aprons. While this can be frustrating for homeowners, our goal is to clear the street completely from curb to curb. You may want to wait until the driver has finished plowing the entire street before completely clearing your driveway apron.
- For your safety, never pass a snowplow in operation. Maintain a safe distance of at least 100 feet behind our snowplow vehicles.
- Every truck has significant blind spots, and drivers have a lot to concentrate on. Never assume the driver can see you.
- The City clears streets according to our priority map, concentrating on main roads first. Please be patient; your driver will get to your street as quickly as possible, and we recognize that every winter weather event is different.



Our snow response team is dedicated to keeping roads open so that Police and Fire can always respond, and to help our residents get where they need to go this winter.

Learn, Train, Operate

Throughout the year, the Fairfield Fire Department engages in training sessions involving a variety of realistic scenarios in different weather conditions, while utilizing specialized tools and equipment. These training opportunities not only keep our members sharp on operational tactics, but it is often through these trainings with other FFD members and mutual-aid partners, that we can instill confidence and skill repetition while in a low-risk, low-stress environment.

The Fairfield Fire Department focuses on regular and ongoing training opportunities so that our members are able to more safely and effectively respond to emergency situations within the City of Fairfield and while serving neighboring communities as mutual aid.

In 2025, FFD members underwent training focused on rope rescue, standpipe connection, EMS skills, tactical decision making, and thermal imaging- just to name a few! We are encouraged by the results of our ongoing training and expect to continue the work in 2026.

Help Us Help You!

Help us keep the community safe this winter by keeping fire hydrants accessible to firefighters during snowy weather. If you have a fire hydrant near your home or in your yard, please keep them clear with these guidelines in mind:

1. Remove any snow and ice on or near the hydrants.
2. Clear a wide enough perimeter around the hydrant for firefighters to work (about 3 feet).
3. Clear a path from the hydrant to the street.

Use caution when shoveling snow and take frequent breaks to rest and hydrate.

Winter Weather Preparedness

While winter weather in the Southwest Ohio area can be unpredictable- ranging from mild temperatures and gray skies to bone-chilling cold and snow- one thing that you can do is be prepared for all conditions. A great place to start in your preparedness journey is ensuring that you have an emergency preparedness kit in your vehicle in case you are ever stranded for a long period of time. Check out the list below for a basic emergency kit template, however, your kit should be tailored to the specific and unique needs of your family- whether you have members with special needs or have small children with particular food preferences or interests- please include additional items that will be helpful for your family!

CAR EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS KIT ITEMS



Keep your home prepared for winter weather by having your fireplace inspected and cleaned annually, prior to lighting a fire for the first time. Also consider using a fireplace heat screen to keep embers inside the fireplace and pets and small children out! While having carbon monoxide detectors on each level of your home is a wise choice year-round, it is especially important if you utilize a gas fireplace in your home for extra heat. Finally, be vigilant to keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from all heat sources, including radiators, fireplaces, wood stoves, space heaters, and candles. Stay safe and warm Fairfield!

Canines in outreach settings, and establishing a department presence at Fairfield-sponsored events like "Groovin' on the Green," "Halloween on the Green," "Red, White & Kaboom," and the annual Touch a Truck. The FFD believes strongly that more low-stress, non-emergency engagement with Fairfield residents can not only bolster community confidence in the members of our department, but also hopes to leverage relationships to encourage residents to strengthen their fire safety awareness and knowledge.

Step back in time! Come discover with us what the land that became Fairfield was like 250 years ago.

As part of the national celebration, we're dedicating a special series in our Fairfield Flyers to the history of this area. Join us as we explore local life in 1776, 1826, 1876, 1926, 1976, and 2026 - six glimpses into 250 years of change right outside your door.

What the Fairfield area was like in 1776

Fairfield has a rich history that stretches back long before its incorporation. To understand what the area would have been like, we need to journey back in time, examining its geological formation and the various Native American peoples.

The Ancient Landscape: A Glacial Legacy

Long before human feet touched this land, the very shape of Fairfield was carved by massive glaciers. During the last ice age, the Wisconsin Glaciation, which peaked around 20,000 years ago, colossal ice sheets covered much of Ohio. As these glaciers advanced and retreated, they dramatically altered the landscape.

The Miami River is a direct result of glacial activity. Meltwater from the glaciers carved out the broad Miami Valley, leaving behind rich, fertile floodplains. The glaciers also deposited vast amounts of till, a mixture of clay, silt, sand, and gravel, which contributes to the productive agricultural soil characteristic of the region. This glacial legacy would have meant a landscape of gently rolling hills, fertile river bottoms, and abundant water sources.

Indigenous Heritage: The First Peoples of Fairfield

For thousands of years, the Fairfield area was home to various indigenous cultures, drawn to the fertile land, abundant wildlife, and strategic river access. Paleo-Indian hunters are believed to have been the region's first inhabitants who arrived in Ohio more than eleven thousand years ago from Siberia via Alaska's Bering Land Bridge.

The Ohio River Valley corridor and closer to home (the lands along the Great Miami and Little Miami Rivers) have been known as the past lands of the Adena and Hopewell cultures. The Adena tradition refers to the diverse groups of indigenous peoples who shared similar cultural practices and inhabited the central and southern regions of Ohio throughout the first millennium B.C.

The Adena people lived in villages and survived by hunting, fishing, and gathering wild plants. They are known to have farmed using tools made of stone, animal bone, and tortoise shell and to grow crops of squash, pumpkins, gourds, sunflowers, and maize.

Although the Adena culture thrived for several centuries, much of what we know of them today is drawn from excavating manmade knolls ("mounds"). The late Esther R. Benzing, lifetime resident and local historian of Fairfield, referenced in the book Fairfield, Ohio, 1978, the work of J.P. McLean, The Mound Builders, 1887. Benzing's reference to the Mound Builders may have been the first introduction of Fairfield's ancient past and the Hopewell culture that prospered on Fairfield soil.
