## COVID-19 Business Resources

State and federal agencies continue to develop guidance and financial resources to assist businesses during this time. These include low-interest and forgivable loan programs through the federal government, payment deferrals for JobsOhio loans, and reimbursements from Ohio Bureau of Workers Compensation. City staff is also willing to assist in navigating available programs and guidance.

## Mayor's Tour Highlights Local Businesses

In response to the COVID-19 situation, Fairfield Mayor Steve Miller launched a tour to highlight locally owned businesses throughout the city. Beginning in April, the tour was hosted using videos posted on Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, and the city website ([www.fairfieldoh.gov](http://www.fairfieldoh.gov)). Local restaurants, shops, and other businesses each shared how they adjusted and found new ways to serve

## New Business Park Planned

Indianapolis-based Ambrose Property Group has acquired 137 acres at 9450 Seward Road, most recently owned by Liberty Mutual Insurance. Ambrose is developing plans to add multiple new buildings at the site, potentially adding more than one million square feet in new construction. The development will be known as Fairfield Commerce Park and be marketed for e-commerce, general distribution, and manufacturing firms.



The first phase will include two large speculative industrial buildings constructed along Seward Road just north of the existing office building. Construction could begin on these buildings later this summer. The city is working with the developer to find a new user for the office building after Liberty Mutual relocates their operations in mid-2021.

## TownePlace Suites Ready to Open

After more than a year of construction, the new TownePlace Suites hotel near the intersection of Route 4 and Seward Road will welcome its first guests. Oxford-based Hotel Development Services, LLC, which also owns the nearby Holiday Inn Express, developed the 83-room property.

TownePlace Suites is an upscale extended stay hotel brand by Marriott. The hotel features studio and one-bedroom units, each with a complete kitchen. The project represents an investment of more than \$11 million in the Route 4 corridor.






### THE SUNSHINE BOYS




### KEN LUDWIG'S BASKERVILLE: A SHERLOCK HOLMES MYSTERY




### LITTLE WOMEN


## Living Legacy Tree Program at Creekside Park



All utility customers received information about the annual report and how to access it on their recent water bills. Hard copies of the report are also available at the City Building, 5350 Pleasant Avenue, or at the Water Treatment Plant, 5021 Groh Lane. The report contains important information about the source and quality of Fairfield's water.

Fairfield is required to test its water regularly to ensure its safety. In 2019, Fairfield's drinking water met all federal and state standards as established by the U.S. and Ohio Environmental Protection Agencies. At no time did testing find contaminants exceeding acceptable levels.



DEPARTMENT SPOTLIGHT: FAIRFIELD POLICE



DID YOU KNOW?

The Fairfield Police Department is authorized by City Council to operate at a maximum strength of 63 police officers. Dispatchers and civil staff play a key role in ensuring the efficient and effective operation of the department. At any given time, there are 5 – 9 patrol officers on duty. Throughout southwest Ohio, the department is known for setting the benchmark for public safety professionalism and a strong commitment to customer service.



Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA)

The Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement approved the award of Advanced Accreditation with Excellence and the Meritorious Award for the Fairfield Police Department. The Accreditation with Excellence Award was created by CALEA as a symbolic incentive for agencies to employ accreditation in a manner that sets the benchmark for public safety professionalism. The Fairfield Police Department is one of three agencies that received the Advanced Accreditation with Excellence Award within its peer review group of 27 departments.

*There are more than 850 law enforcement agencies in Ohio. The Fairfield Police Department is one of just 57 law enforcement agencies in the state that carries the distinction of "CALEA Accreditation" from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement (CALEA). Because the department complies with all 484 standards - the additional distinctions of Advanced Accreditation with Excellence and the Meritorious Award have been bestowed the organization.*

Fairfield Police add value to their service by giving presentations and training to the public on avoiding scams that target the elderly, defense against rape aggression, and what to do in the case of an active shooter.

In collaboration with Fairfield City School District, the department has assigned four School Resource Officers (SROs) and one DARE officer to protect and to serve our youth in the schools. The DARE Program (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) consists of educating our young people about avoiding alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, bullying, and gangs. In addition to protecting our children, SROs are a positive role model for pupils. SROs supplement our service to the community by teaching about technology awareness and social media crimes, while working in suicide prevention, anti-bullying, and self-defense.

The Fairfield Police Department has three canine units that detect narcotics, track, and search buildings or areas for evidence and articles. Officers also work in a bike patrol unit at major events and during juvenile diversion programs.

Fairfield PD's effectiveness isn't just made possible by our team of public servants. We are fortunate to have an engaged community that volunteers through the Fraternal Order of Police Associates (FOPA) and the Law Enforcement Explorer Program. Each year approximately 30 members assist the department with OVI Checkpoints, National Night Out, and Shred Day for Crime Stoppers.

## Keep Grass Clippings Out Of The Street

As you continue to mow your lawn this summer, the City of Fairfield reminds you to keep your grass clippings on your lawn and out of the street. Blowing grass clippings into the street is a property maintenance code violation.

The City has adopted these regulations because grass clippings in the street:

- Can clog storm sewers and drywells
- Will negatively impact local streams and waterways
- Are dangerous for motorists and bicyclists
- Makes your property look unkempt
- Can harm property values and upset your neighbors

Please try to avoid this violation by properly bagging and disposing or by sweeping your clippings back into your yard where they will compost.

## Cleaning Your House Siding

Vinyl siding is a popular exterior finishing product on homes in Fairfield because it is durable. Proper maintenance can keep it looking clean and attractive for a long time. If not properly maintained, however, vinyl siding can develop discoloration or staining.

Typically, green or black discoloration on siding is caused by either algae or mold. Algae and mold are not the same organisms and have different requirements for cleanup.

Algae growth is mainly a cosmetic issue. It often grows on the sides of houses that don't get much direct sunlight (usually the north side). It can feed on dirt or sugary tree sap that sticks to the siding. Algae can easily be removed by scrubbing with a mild soap or by utilizing a pressure washer. Professional help may be required for two-story houses or other hard to reach areas.

Mold on siding is a much more serious problem that might require professional removal for safety reasons. On the outside of houses, it is typically caused by excessive water from gutter or drainpipe problems.

Most of the discoloration on Fairfield houses is simply algae. Residents are encouraged to regularly clean their siding, which will improve the appearance of their house and will help maintain property values in their neighborhood.
