## *About the Artists*



### **Ian Irmisch - Bodhran, Emcee**

Ian founded the Tartan Terrors with his late sister Ellen in 1996, and Celtic performances haven't been the same since. Ian has been lucky enough to have performed his way through Canada, the United States, and Great Britain.



### **Peter McArthur - Bagpipes, Whistle, Vocals**

Peter has been performing the traditional music of the Great Highland Bagpipe for over 25 years. Peter performs at over 250 events throughout each year and spends his spring and fall giving regular weekend recitals at Pinehurst Resort.



### **Emily Yarascavitch - Fiddle, Step Dance, Vocals**

Emily is a fiddling and step dancing sensation. She began step dancing at four years old and took up fiddle shortly after. She spent numerous years in the Canadian competition circuit, achieving prestigious awards in both fiddle and step dance.



### **Charlie Mckittrick - Drums, Vocals**

Charlie joined forces with the Tartan Terrors in November 2016. He's performed internationally including stops in Germany, Singapore, nine provinces in Canada and 33 states in the USA.



### **Phill Hood - Electric Guitar, Acoustic Guitar, Vocals**

Phill, Tartan Terrors' resident Newfoundlander, has been an active member of the band since 2011. A seasoned songwriter and performer in his own right, Phill brings an east coast flare to the Terror's Celtic sound.



### **Chris Kerba - Bodhran, Acoustic Guitar, Vocals**

Chris has been with the Terrors for over a decade. He shares his time and talents with another band, Eclectic Revival (@e\_rev), which has helped turn him into the performer he is today.



### **Jake Saenz - Bass Guitar, Vocals**

Jake is an American/Canadian musician based out of Toronto who has been pumping out the low end as the Tartan Terrors' bass guitarist for over 10 years.

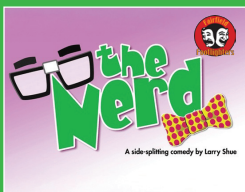
