UCR Part I Crime Statistics

Snapshot Report

Table 1 shows the number of UCR Part I offenses reported to the Fairfield Police Department beginning in the year 2010. The data from 2010-2019 suggest a downward trend in reported crime. In 2014, there was a noticeable increase from the prior year in the number of thefts, which were primarily related to thefts from vehicles. There was also a noticeable decrease in the number of robberies from the previous year.

Violent & Property Crimes

UCR classifies homicide, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault as violent crimes. Burglary, theft, auto theft, and arson are classified as property crimes. In 2019, 91.1% of the reported Part I crimes to the Fairfield Police have been property crimes. Using the latest published UCR data from 2018, Chart 1 and Chart 2 compare the violent and property crime rates in Fairfield to the overall rates in Ohio² and to the rates in the cities of Hamilton and Fairborn³. 




Property Crimes

Chart 3 provides statistical information on burglaries. For 2019, burglaries account for 11% of all reported property crimes. The vast majority of burglaries occur in residential areas. These burglaries often occur during daylight hours when homeowners are at work or on vacation, and entry is often gained through unlocked doors and windows. Chart 3 also provides statistical information on the various types of theft committed in the City of Fairfield⁴. For 2019, thefts *from* autos account for 22% of all reported property crimes. These thefts are often the most reported Part I crime to the Fairfield Police Department but one of the easiest to prevent.
