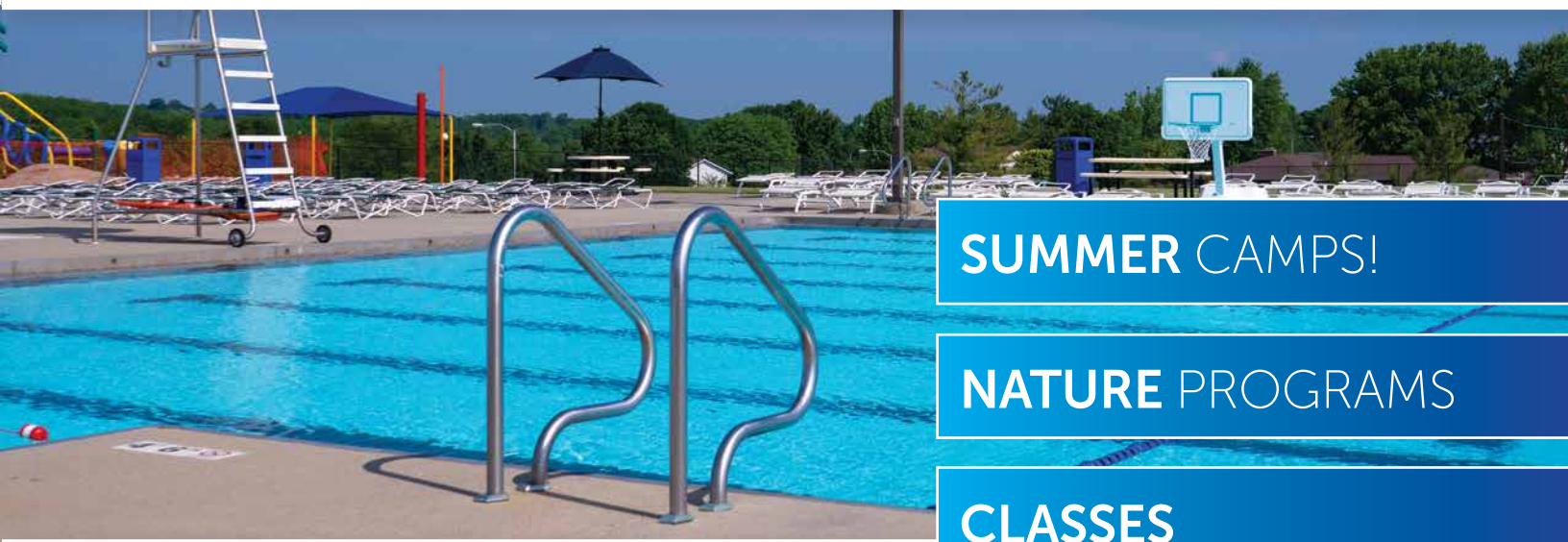

In an effort to facilitate smaller gatherings, the City of Fairfield will host a drive-by Memorial Day parade in several locations throughout the City. The parade will start at the Fairfield Community Arts Center at 10 a.m. and drive by many public locations for viewing opportunities throughout Fairfield, including:
